Trim The Patterned Tree

Materials:

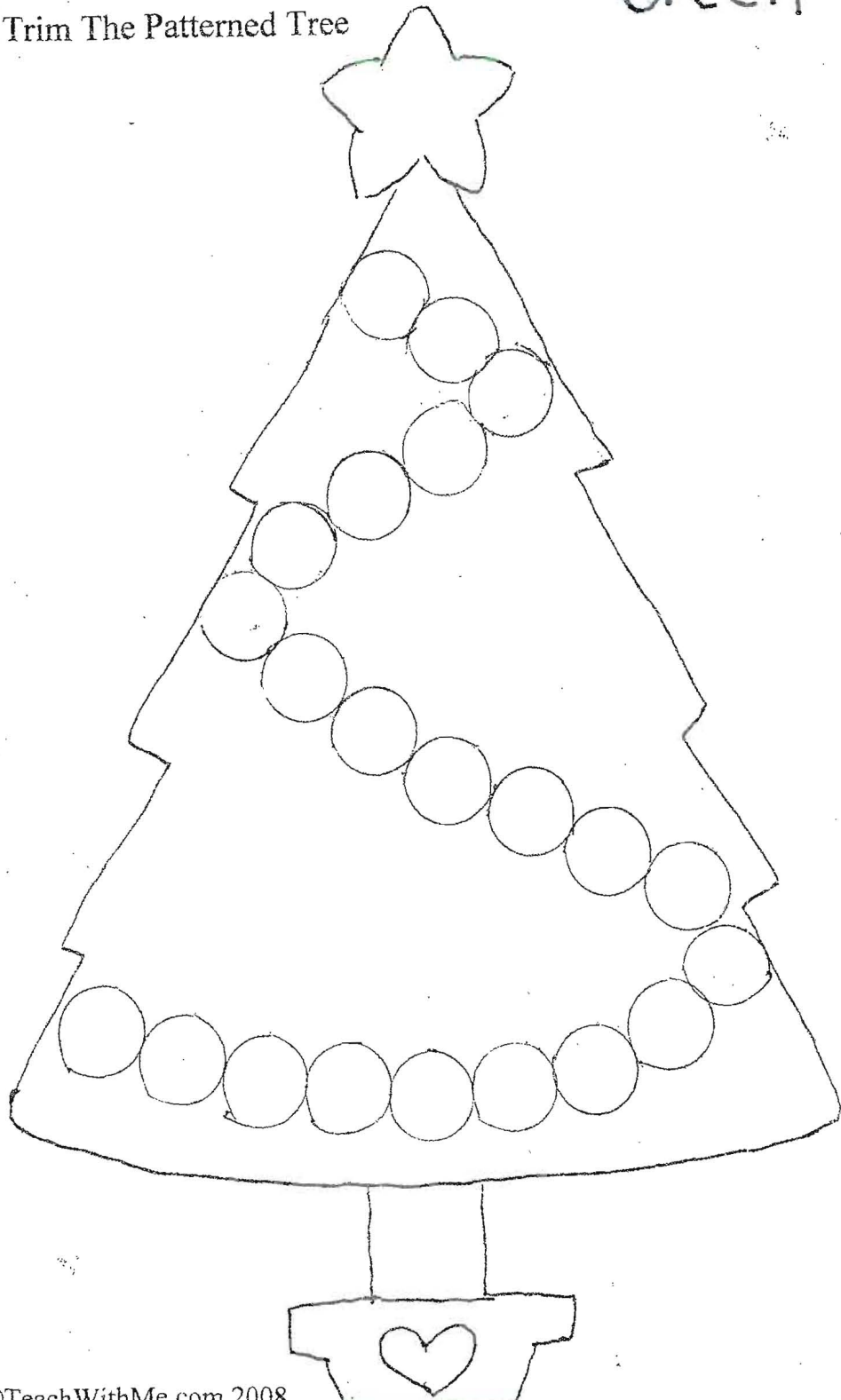
- Green construction paper
- Hole punch
- Yarn
- Circle, heart & star stickers or crayons
- Master

Directions:

1. Run off master on green construction paper; 1 page is enough for 2 children.
2. Cut in half; children will cut out their tree ornament around the edges.
3. You decide if you want the children to COLOR the circles with a crayon making a pattern, or use stickers.
4. I have my students use circle stickers, and fill in every other circle.
5. They also get to put a star and heart sticker on the top and bottom of the tree.
6. Punch a hole in the top and tie with a piece of yarn.
7. This does not have to be an ornament. It makes a nice bookmark too.
8. My students decorate an ornament bag that I hang up the first week of December.
9. Each day we make an ornament as part of our center activities. They put their ornaments in this bag.
10. On party day they take their bag home, spill it out and ooh-ahh with their parents as they hang them on their tree.
11. Opening this ornament bag helps, as they also take a bag of Christmas presents home, that I do NOT want their families to open 'til Christmas. (See my letter.) ☺
12. I like having the ornament bag. It's a decoration for the room and a safe place for the children's work.
13. It's also a great time saver for me when they make ornaments; I don't have to put it in their Take Home Folder weekly.
14. Parents get it all at once and are less likely to lose them and more likely to hang them up!

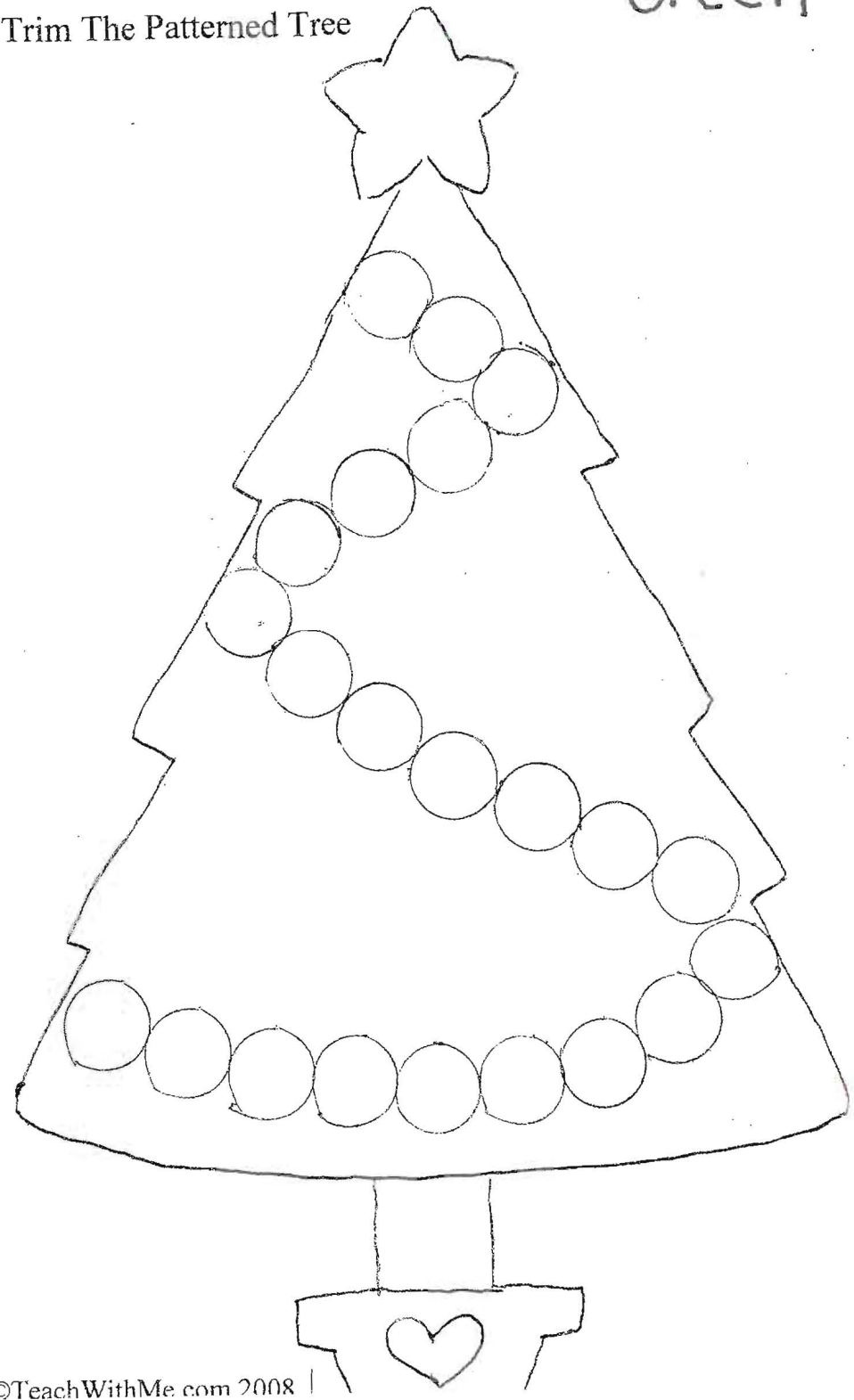

Fringed Triangle Tree

Shape Review

Materials:

- 9x12 Green paper for the tree and blue or white construction paper for the background.
- An assortment of colored construction paper squares and rectangles for gifts and brown tree trunks.
- Scissors
- Glue sticks
- Star stickers
- Round stickers for ornaments
- Marker or crayons to write name.
- *Optional:* glitter glue for garland

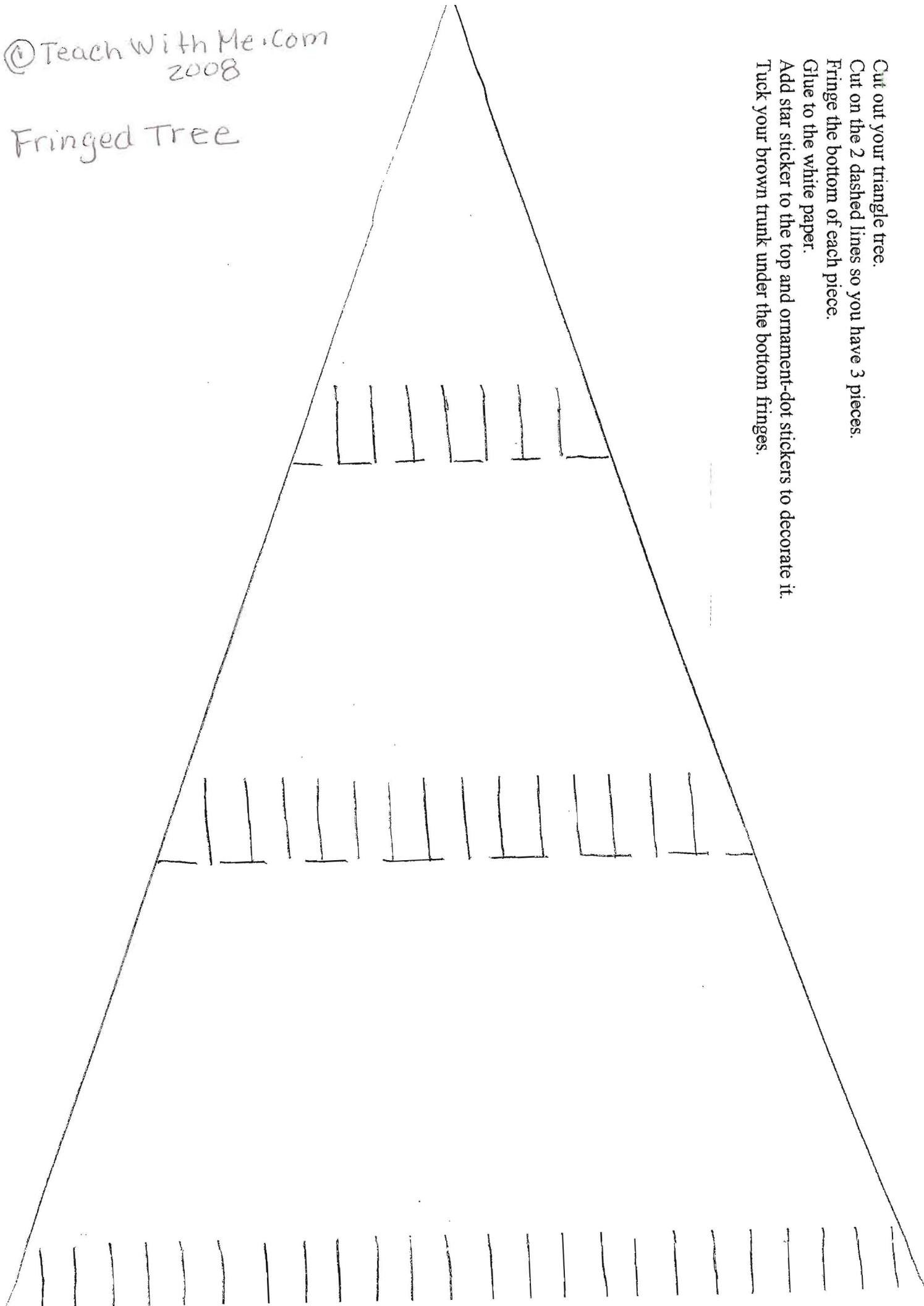
Directions:

1. Children cut out the triangle.
2. Children cut on the dashed lines to make 3 parts to their tree.
3. Children snip-cut and fringe the bottom of their tree.
4. Children glue their tree to white or blue construction paper.
5. Children put circle stickers for ornaments on their tree.
6. Children put a star sticker on the top.
7. Children glue a rectangle brown trunk on the bottom.
8. Children glue rectangle and square presents under the tree.
9. Children write their name on the back of the paper.
10. For a bit of pizzazz and glitter glue garland.

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Fringed Tree

Cut out your triangle tree.
Cut on the 2 dashed lines so you have 3 pieces.
Fringe the bottom of each piece.
Glue to the white paper.
Add star sticker to the top and ornament-dot stickers to decorate it.
Tuck your brown trunk under the bottom fringes.



Small-Medium-Large Symmetry Trees

Materials:

- Green construction paper.
- Scissors
- Yarn
- *Optional*: sequins, buttons, stickers, glitter glue, white puffy paint, bingo dabbers

Directions:

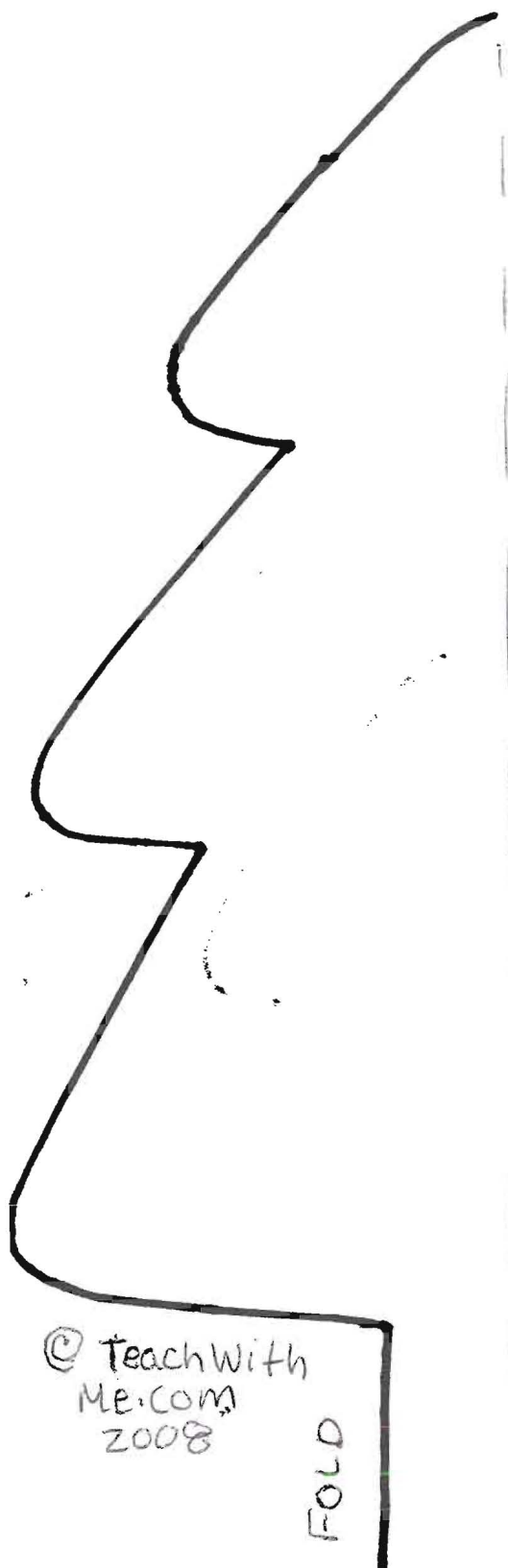
1. There are lots of things you can do with these trees.
2. Keep it simple and let the children cut out one or all of them in a review of Sm. Med. Lg.
3. Punch a hole in the sides and string them horizontally.
4. Punch a hole top-to-bottom and string them vertically.
5. Use white puffy paint to add snow.
6. Use glitter glue to add garland.
7. Have the children decorate each tree differently:
8. Stickers for one, sequins for another, buttons or bingo dots for the large one,
9. If you have a hand-held roller that makes paper look like corrugated cardboard, let your students run it through “Mr. Cruncher Muncher” for a great look and fun fine motor skill.
10. Use white glue and New Year’s confetti for a festive look.
11. Have each child cut two of the medium size one and make it 3-Dimensional. The top and bottom trees would be flat on their “stringer” and the medium middle tree would be 3-dimensional for a cool Yule look.

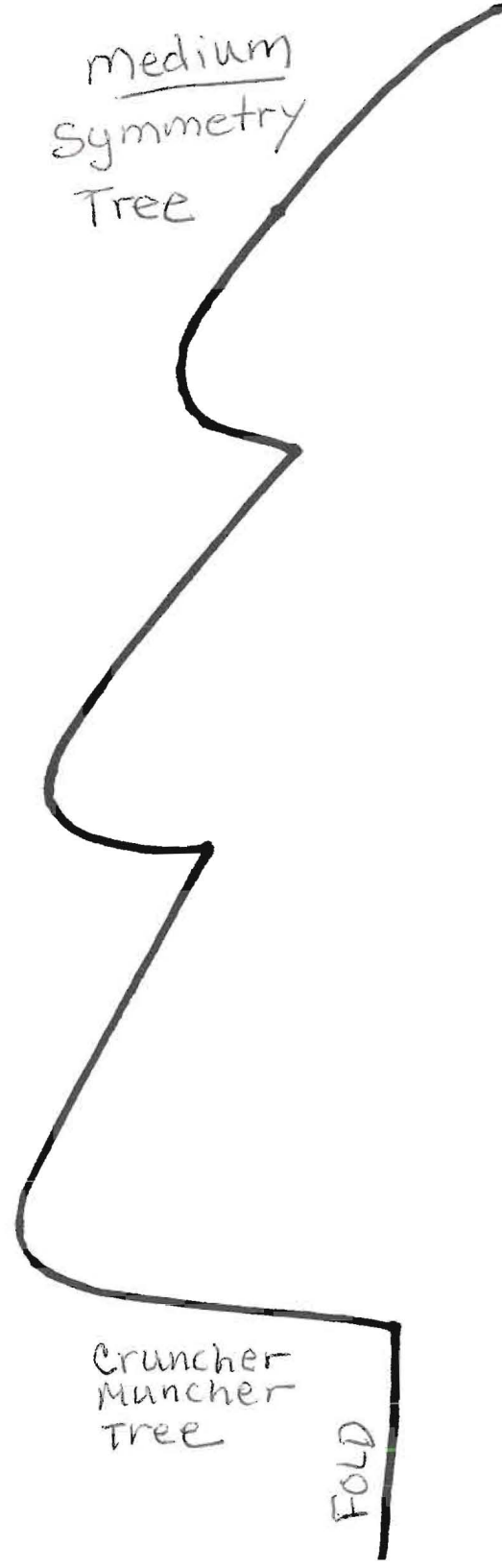

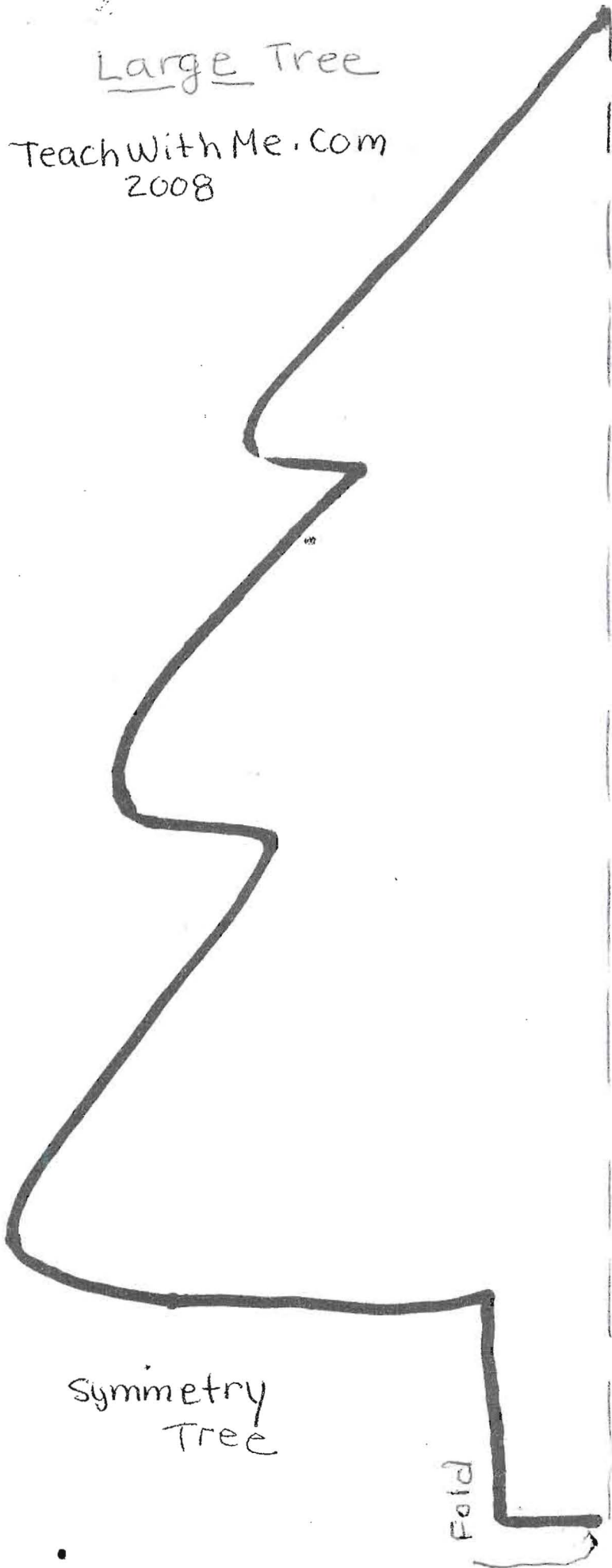

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Snip & Cut 3-Part Triangle Tree

Large and Small

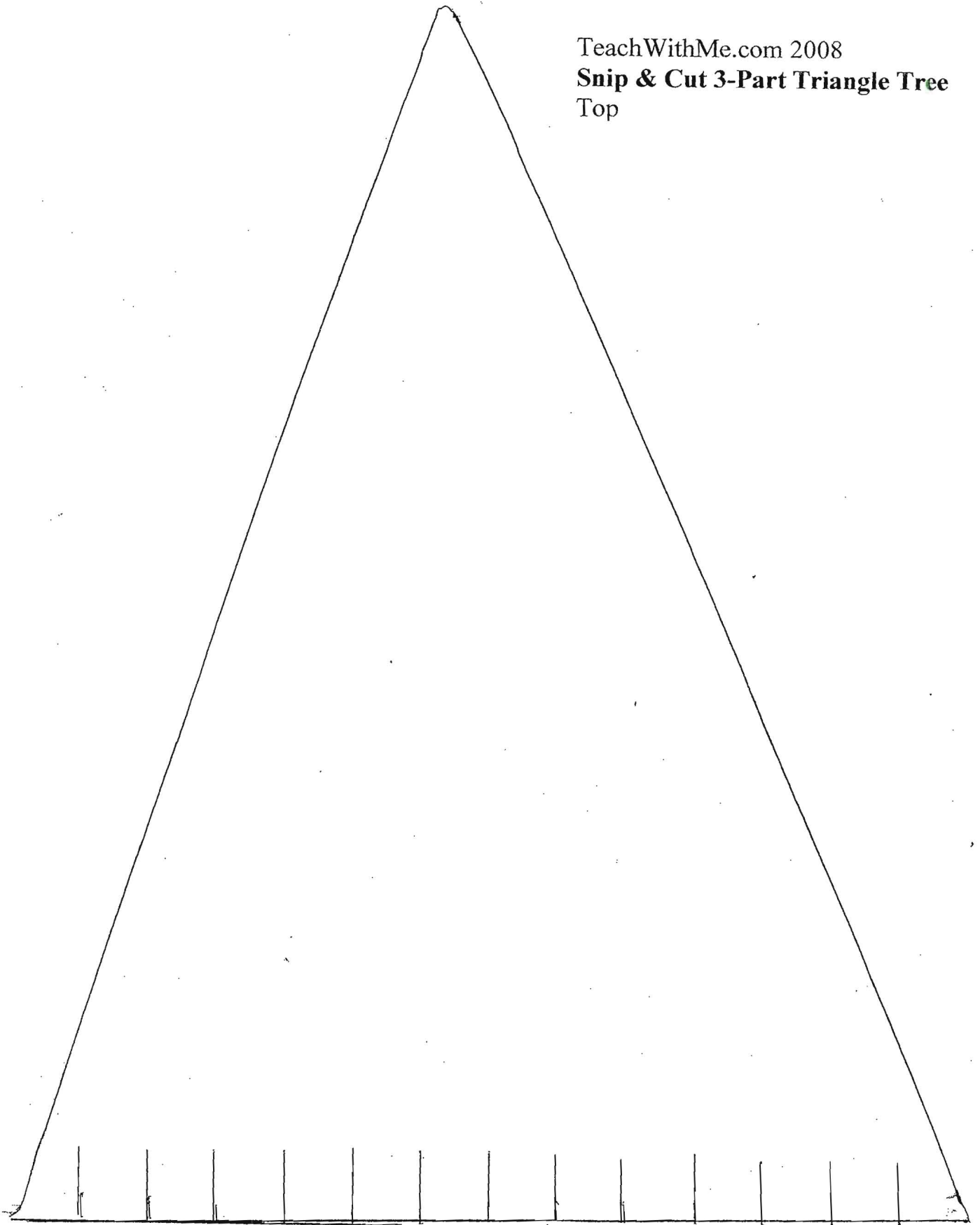
Materials:

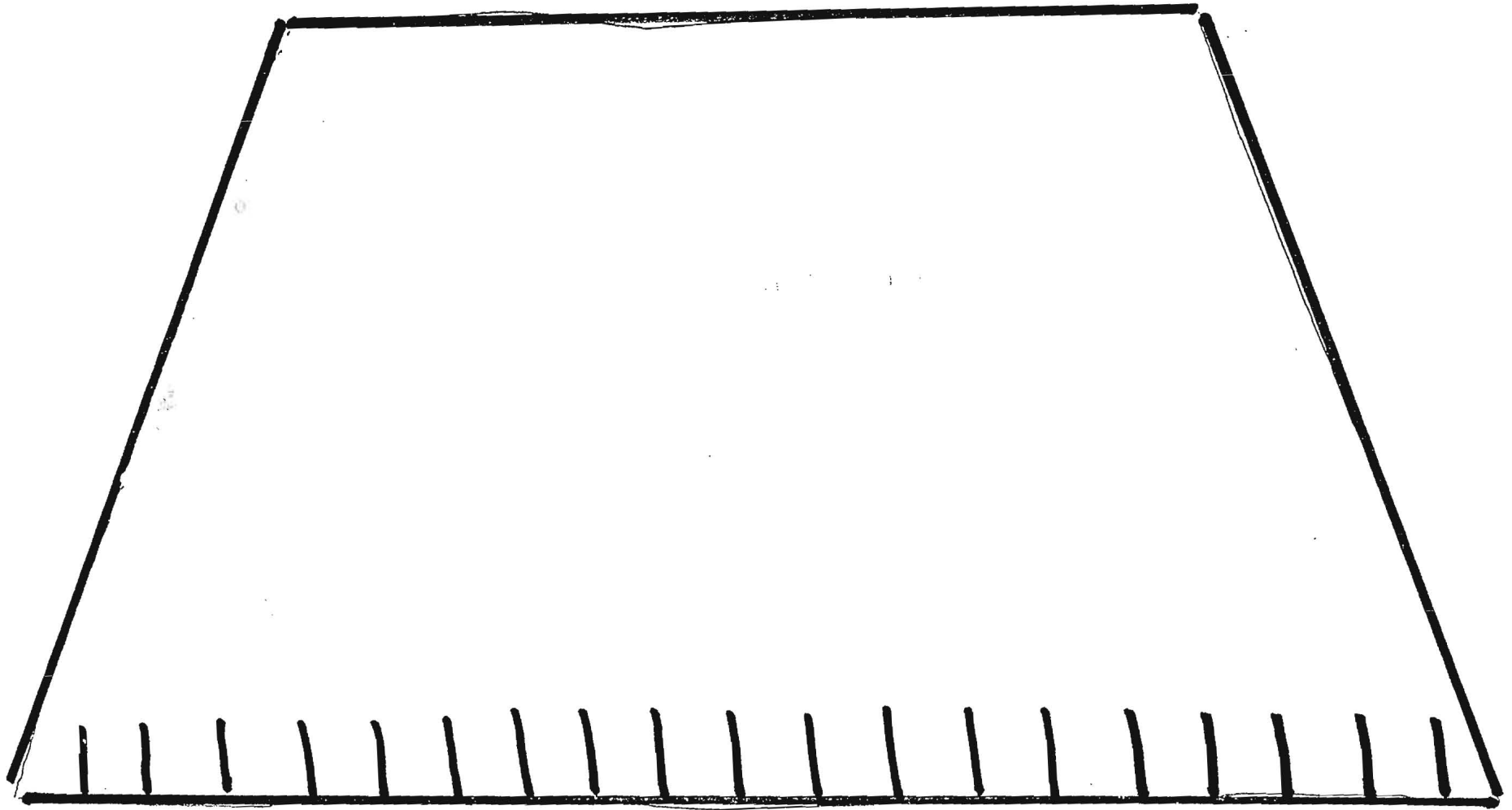
- Green construction paper
- Scraps of brown construction paper to make a tree trunk
- 12 x 24 blue construction paper (If you do large one.)
- Scissors
- Glue stick
- Optional: Stickers
- Optional: glitter
- Optional: Q- tips & red or white paint
- Optional: punched out yellow stars

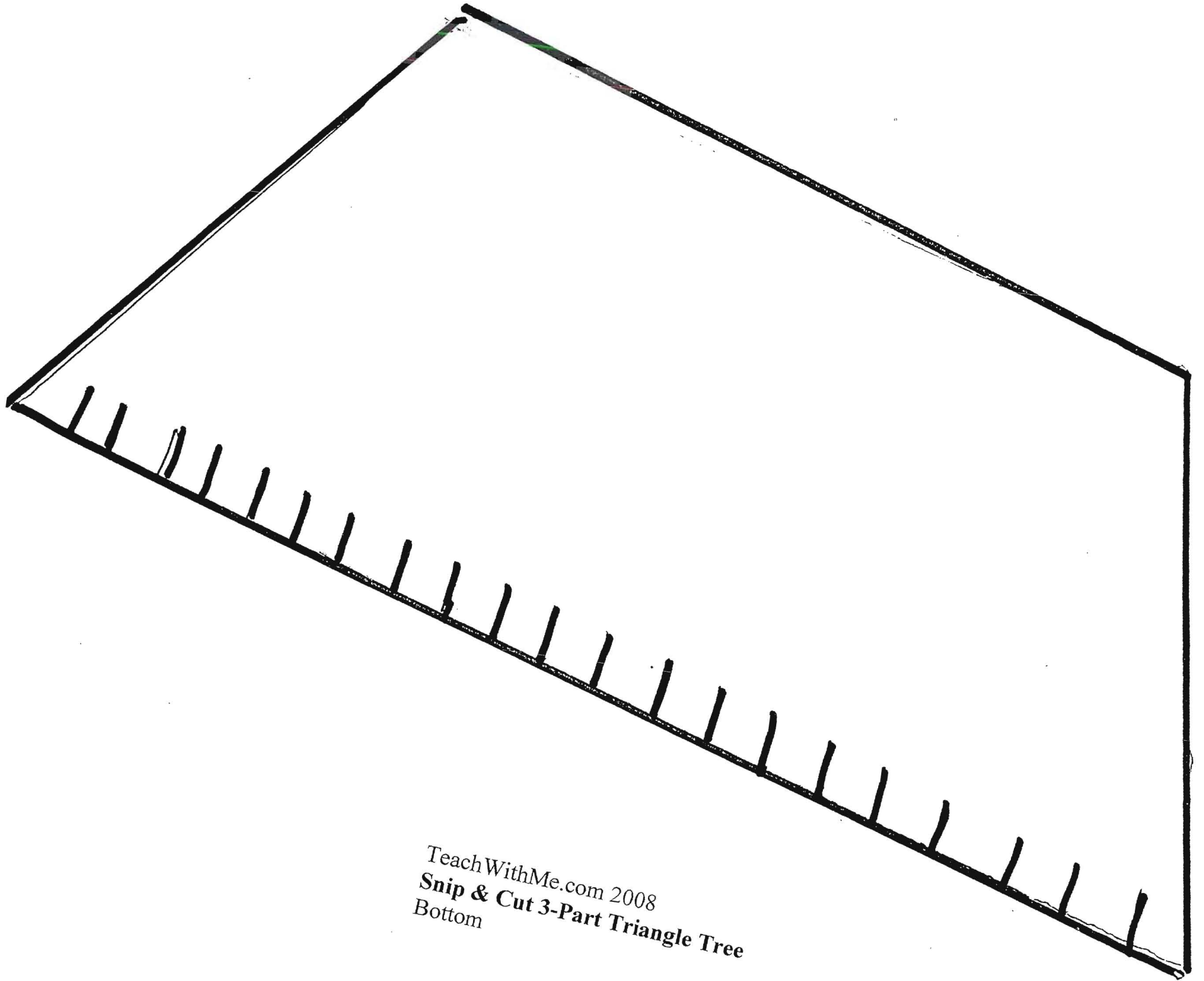
Directions:

1. Run off master
2. Cut strips of brown construction paper to make a trunk.
3. Children cut out parts of their tree. If you think it's too much cutting, have them just do the top + the snip-fringe cutting. This is what I do.
4. Children glue their pieces to the large blue paper.
5. Ruffle the fringe.
6. Glue star to the top and trunk to the bottom.
7. There are several options for decorating and I have done all three. They all look nice and the children have enjoyed each way.
8. Work one-on-one with the children at a center. Lay their tree in a box. Drizzle white glue in a garland line on the tree. Have them sprinkle silver glitter on the glue. Shake off excess and set aside to dry.
9. Put small paper plates with a dollop of red paint on their tables and give them a Q-tip to dab ornament dots on their trees. You could also let them use their pointer finger and press, for a bigger ornament.
10. I've also given them white paint on plates and let them use Q-tips to put snowflakes on their trees and on the blue background.
11. Give them a selection of circular stickers and a specific number that they can stick on each section so they are working on groups/sets.
12. Children write their name on the top of the blue paper.
13. These make a nice decoration hung up in a line on the hallway wall.
14. They also look great hung back-to-back from the ceiling.
15. I've included a poem. You can glue it to the bottom blue portion of the finished piece. I like to include poetry in our art projects, as it is an ongoing reading genre through out the year.

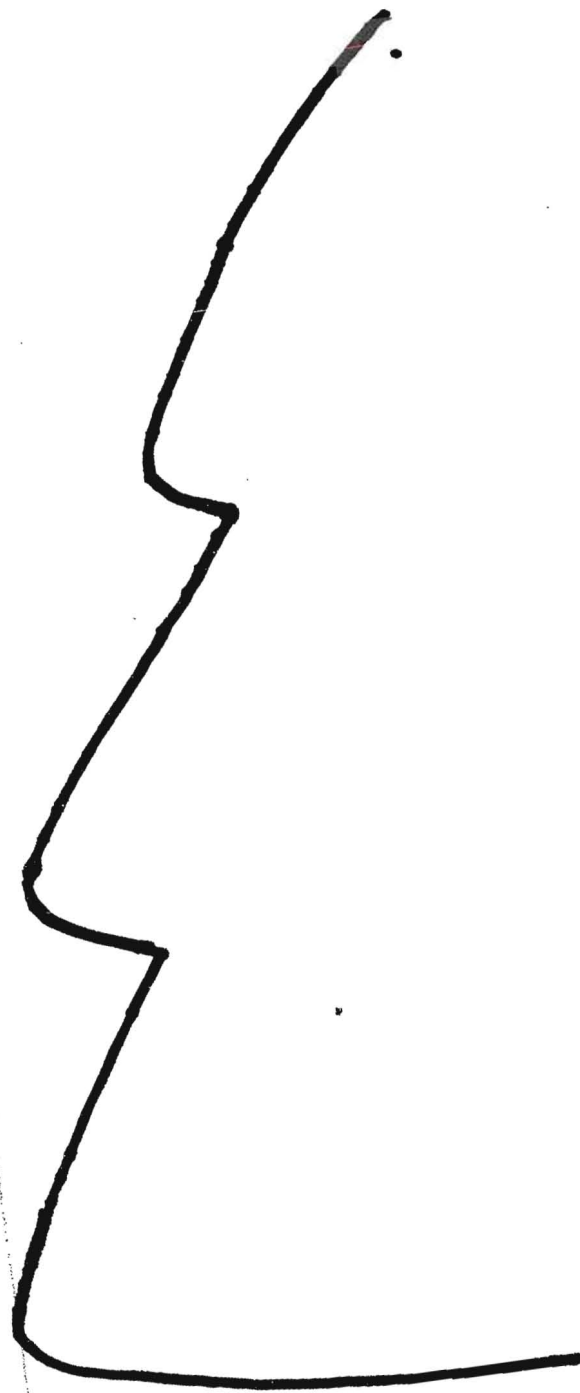
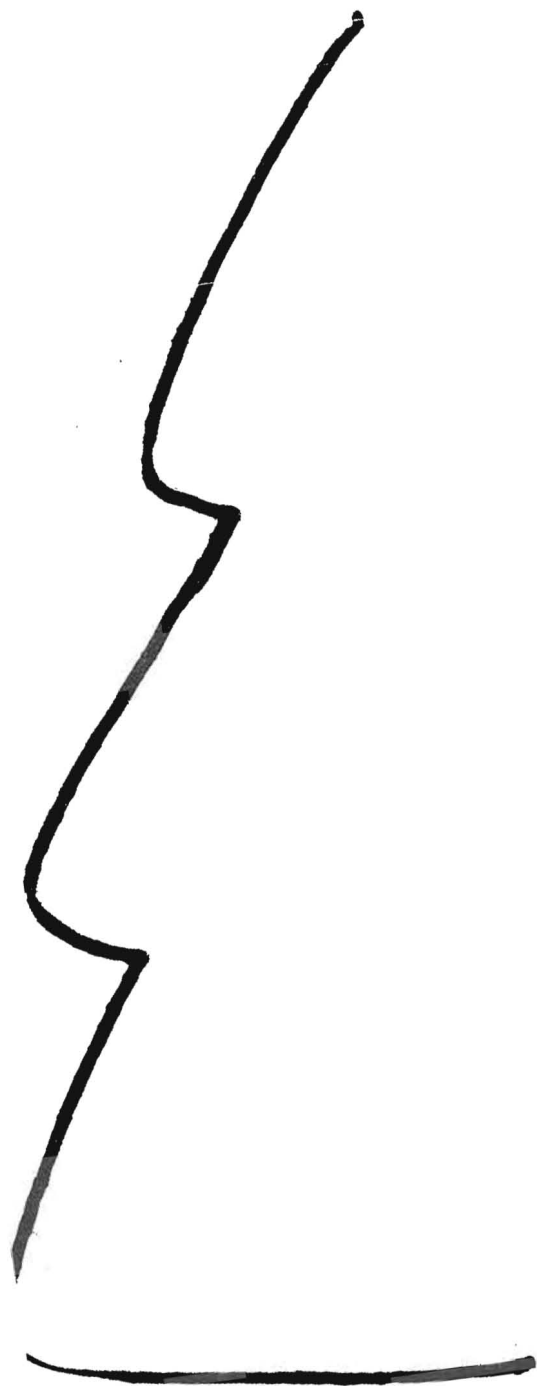
- Green Construction Paper

- Scissors

Directions:

1. Run off master
2. Children keep paper FOLDED and CUT on black line. (Review SYMMETRY.
3. Children work on groups/sets and using the dobber dot a specific number of white dots on their tree.

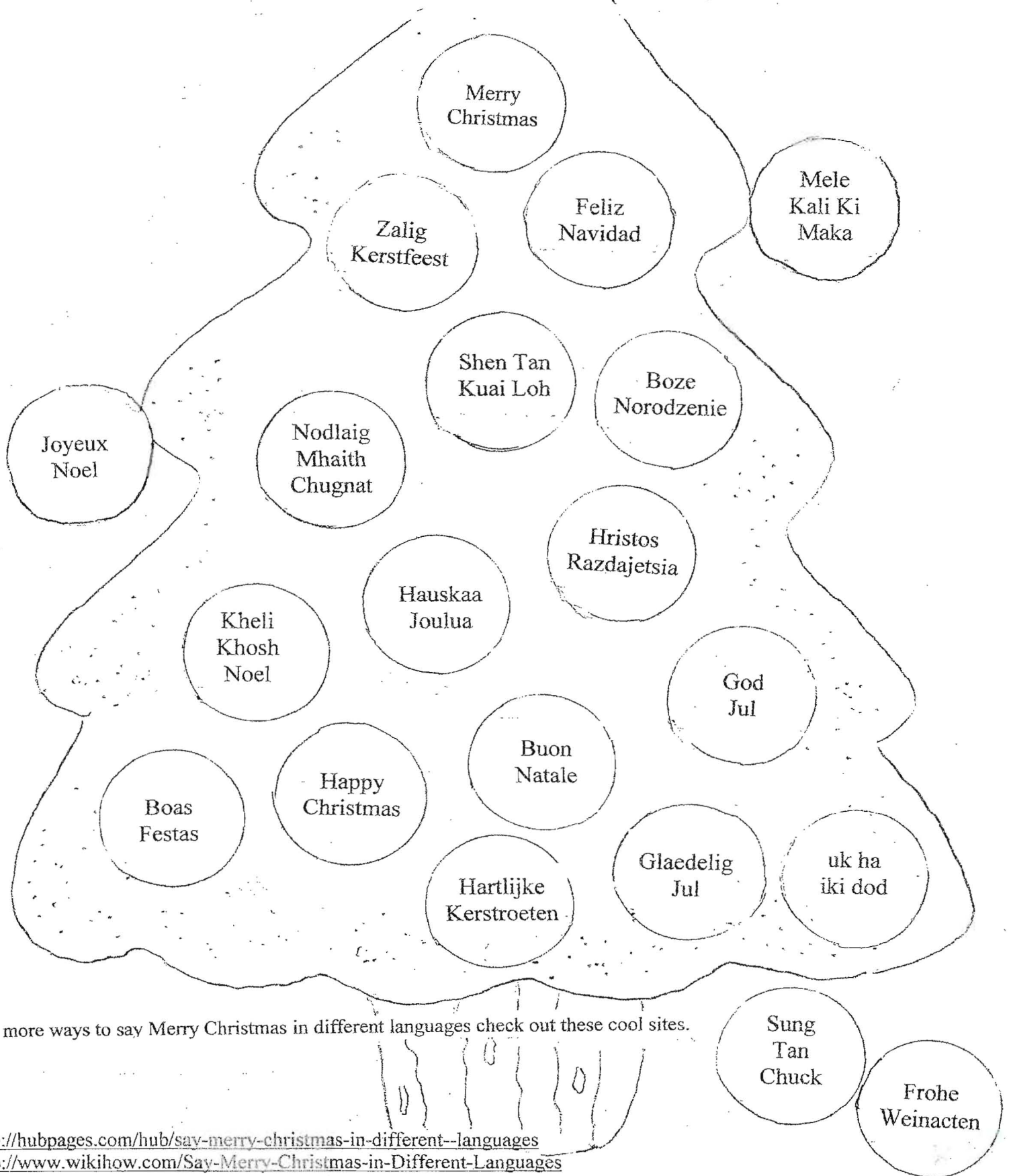
No Matter How You Say It...

- Have students trace the ornaments with the different ways to say “Merry Christmas” in different colors. Have them color them in lightly so that they don’t cover the saying.
- Older students can go online and see if they can find out which balls are which languages. You could set a timer and offer a prize.
- Mount on a sheet of construction paper and give as a card.

Trace the Numbers, Shapes or Letters

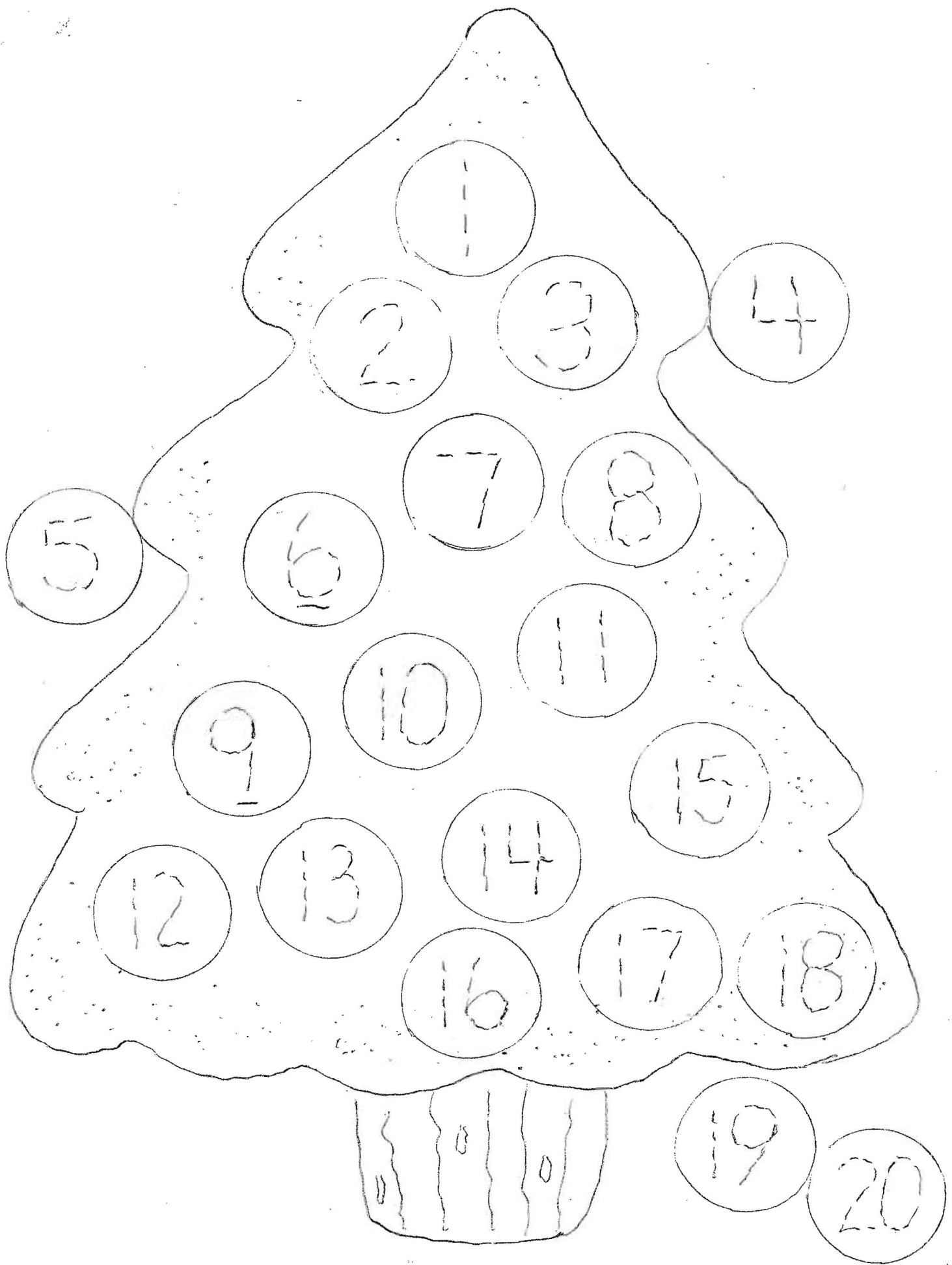
- I’ve given you numbers 1-20, counting to 100 by 10’s and a blank sheet for you to write in your own numbers, or math equations.
- There is a blank sheet of 26 and one of 18.
- Children can trace the number and then color in their ornament.
- I have my students trace the numbers with a black marker and then color each ornament a different color. I also have them color the tree green and the trunk brown.
- You could play this as an “I Spy” game. I whole-group assess as they play.
- You can make this a Bingo-Dot center and give them a variety of colors to choose from.
- I have given you the upper and lower case alphabets as well.
- These too work great as I Spy and Bingo-Dot sheets and offer opportunities for assessment and one-on-one help.
- Or run off an extra sheet, and have the children find the letters in their name and only color/Bingo-dot those ornaments.
- Do similar activities with the shape sheet.

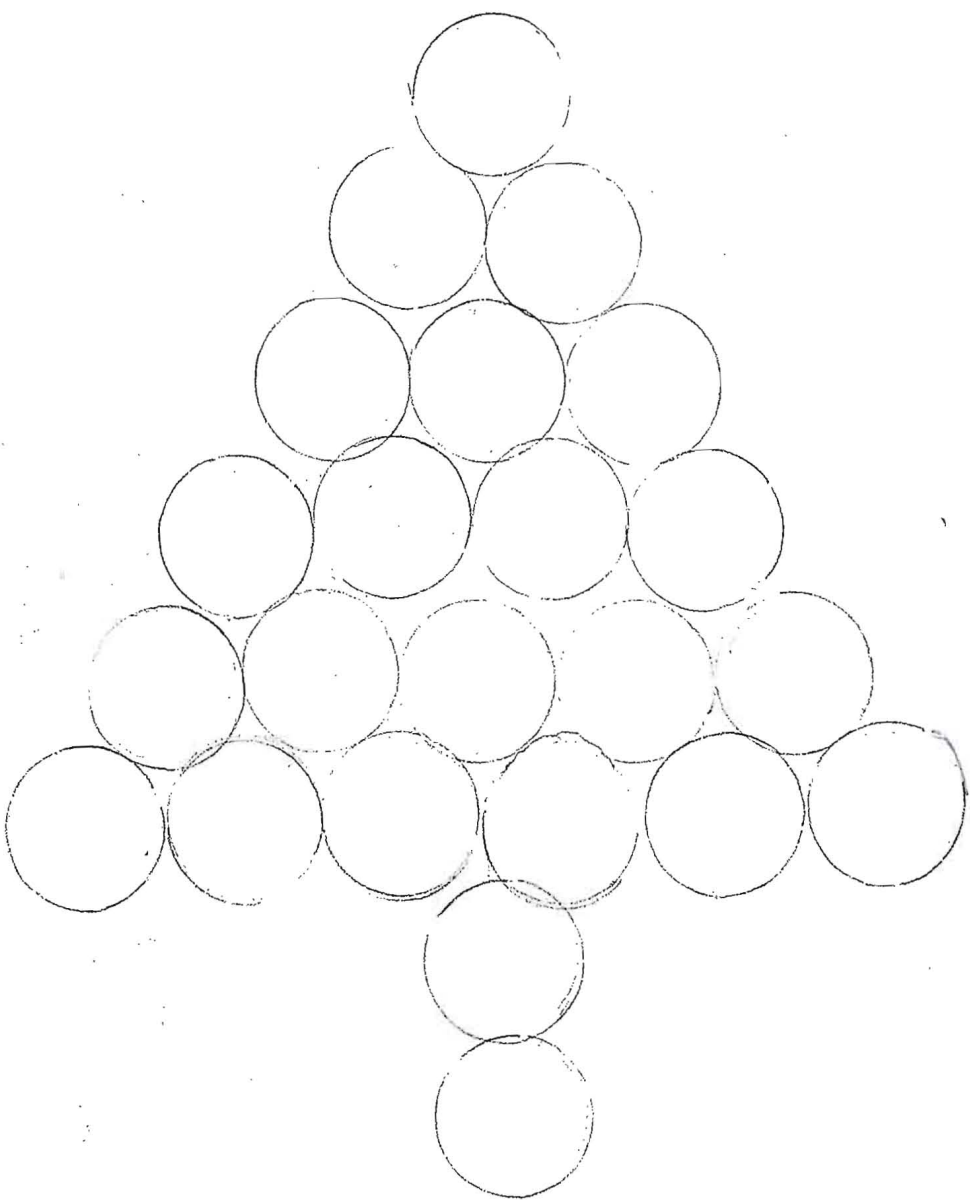
Tissue Paper Tree

Materials:

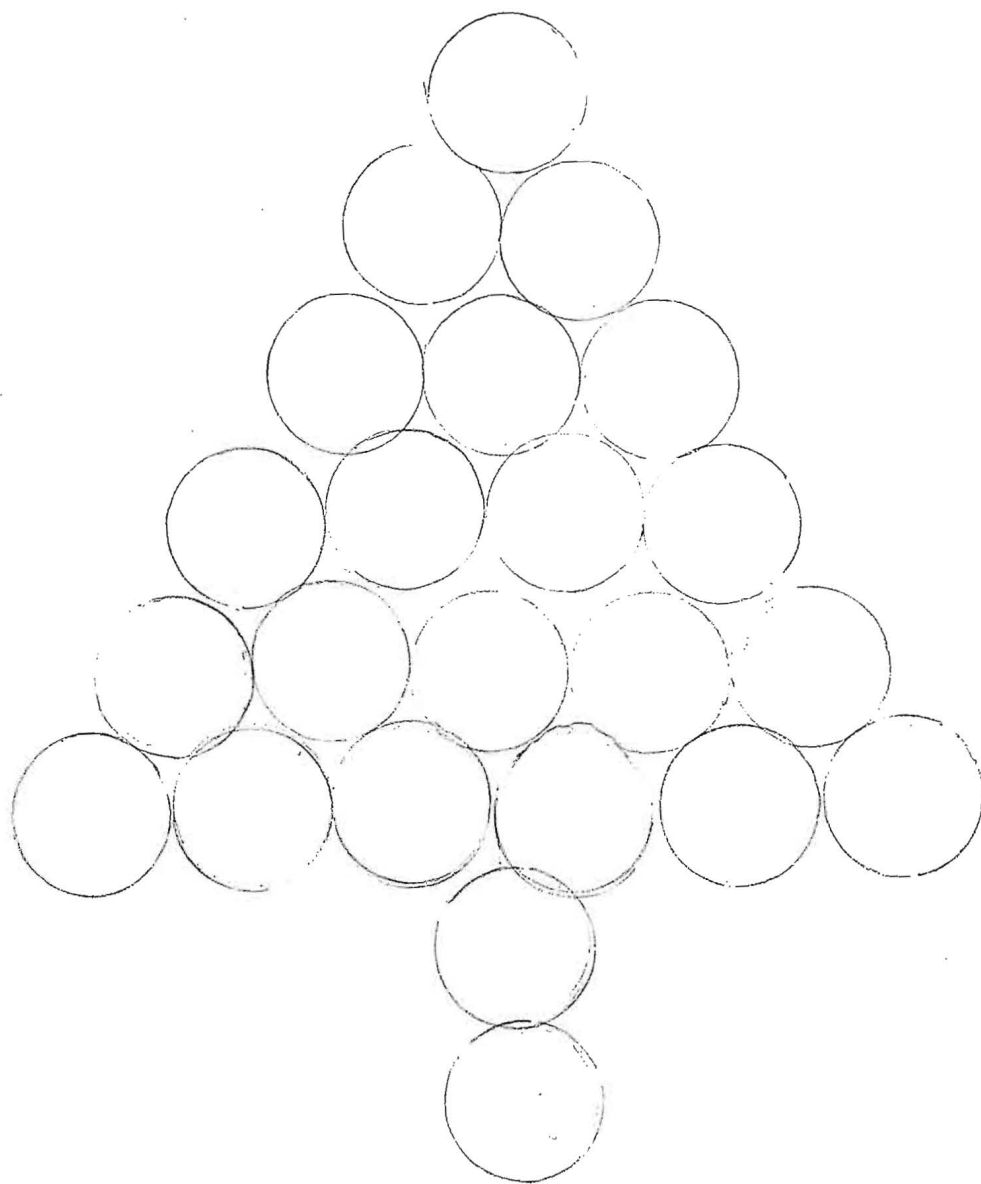
- Green & brown tissue paper
- Yellow star punched stars
- Blue construction paper
- White glue

Directions:

1. Run master off on blue construction paper. This is enough for two students.
2. Rip up pieces of green tissue and wad them into loose balls.
3. Put a drop of glue in the circles of the tree and put the tissue balls in each one.
4. Do the same with the brown tissue paper and the tree-trunk circles.
5. Write your name in the middle of the bottom of the page.
6. Glue a paper star to the top of your tree.

Materials:

- Permanent Paint; I like to use Metallic Colors for a bit of pizzazz
- Q-tips
- Ceramic tile

Watch for these at garage sales from newly built homes. I pick mine up for .10¢ each. You can also buy them at home building stores.

- Christmas Tree stamp

Directions:

1. Parents can use these as a trivet to put a hot dish on, or they can heat them in the microwave for 20 seconds and put them in a bun basket to keep bread warm.
2. I pre-stamp the tree, but you could have your students do this.
3. Write the child's name on the back of the tile.
4. Child dips a Q-tip into the desired color of paint and makes dots on their tree.
5. Remind them to stay INSIDE the tree.
6. Set aside to dry.
7. We later wrap as one of their Christmas gifts to their family.

3-D Tree Dangler

One of the 3-D shapes I have to teach is the cone. This is a fun way to help reinforce that vocabulary word.

Materials:

- Red, green, yellow, and brown construction paper.
- Yarn
- Scissors
- Glue stick
- Masters
- Red paint
- Something to put paint in like a paper plate for dipping.
- Paint shirts
- Protractor to punch a hole
- Stapler
- Scotch Tape
- **Optional:** student photo

Directions:

Prep:


- Make a template of the tree.
- It's on 2 pieces here, as it needs to be on one sheet of 12x24 green construction paper.
- Trace the tree on the construction paper.
- My 2 pieces fit together at the arrows.
- The dashed line on A piece is where you will wrap B piece around (or the right side of your whole piece) and match up to the dashed lines and staple to make a 3-D tree.
- To make the traced wrap-lines on your template, cut out your template, then cut out this shape and place it on the top left and trace it with a dashed line.
- Make templates of the other pieces. I have the stars pre-cut.
- I've also given you a master of the "Merry Christmas" heart to run off on a Duplo-so you have the words right on the heart if you want. I write *Feliz Navidad* for my Spanish students.
- Cut 36 inch lengths of yarn and tie a loop at the top.
- I have also had a volunteer pre-wrap and staple the toilet paper tubes
- Make a loop and tie a knot on a 36 inch piece of yarn.

The next day:


1. My students CUT out their hearts (first) and then their tree.
2. They raise their hand when they are done with their tree.
3. I help them wrap it into a cone shape, by following the dashed lines.
4. Use the dashed lines as a guide to make the cone shape then place the tree on the table so it sits flat and adjust to the desired size. (Things vary depending on how your students cut out their tree.) ☺
5. I use a piece of scotch tape to temporarily hold it in place, if the little ones' hands aren't as helpful, and then I staple.
6. It's helpful if you have one of those extra-long staplers so you can put a staple at the top too; if not a piece of scotch tape or glue dot, is helpful.
7. You may want to trim the bottom of their tree to make it even.
8. Put glue on pre-cut star.
9. Place yarn down the middle and place the other star on top, matching the points.
10. Tie double knot 1-finger lengths down from the star. A pony bead works nice too.
11. Lay the yarn through the tree, before you wrap and staple the tree so you won't have to putz with threading it later; let it dangle down.
12. Wrap the pre-cut brown rectangle around the t.p. roll and staple the top and bottom.
13. To save time, I have these pre-done.
14. Cut out the circle and tab piece.
15. Poke a hole in the center.
16. Staple it to the top of the t.p. roll.
17. Using the protractor, thread the piece of yarn through it.
18. Slide the t.p. roll so that it hangs under the tree, shove it up so that you can tie a triple knot starting at the bottom of the tree.
19. Put glue on one side of the Merry Christmas heart.
20. 2-finger lengths from the trunk, lay the yarn down the middle of the heart.
21. Place the other heart on top, match it up and press down.
22. Write children's name on the other side of the heart.
23. You can put their student photo on the side with their name for a bit of keepsake pizzazz. ☺
24. I have them shove the trunk and heart under their tree so that their tree is sitting on their desk. They put on a paint shirt and...
25. Children dip their pointer finger in red paint and dot on ornaments.
26. Set aside to dry. I tape them on a ledge so they don't smear.
27. Suspend from the ceiling or along a wall.
