

## **5 Little Pumpkins Ordinal Number Booklet and Dice Games**

### **Materials:**

- Orange construction paper
- Crayons
- Scissors
- Stapler
- Glue stick
- Masters

### **Directions:**

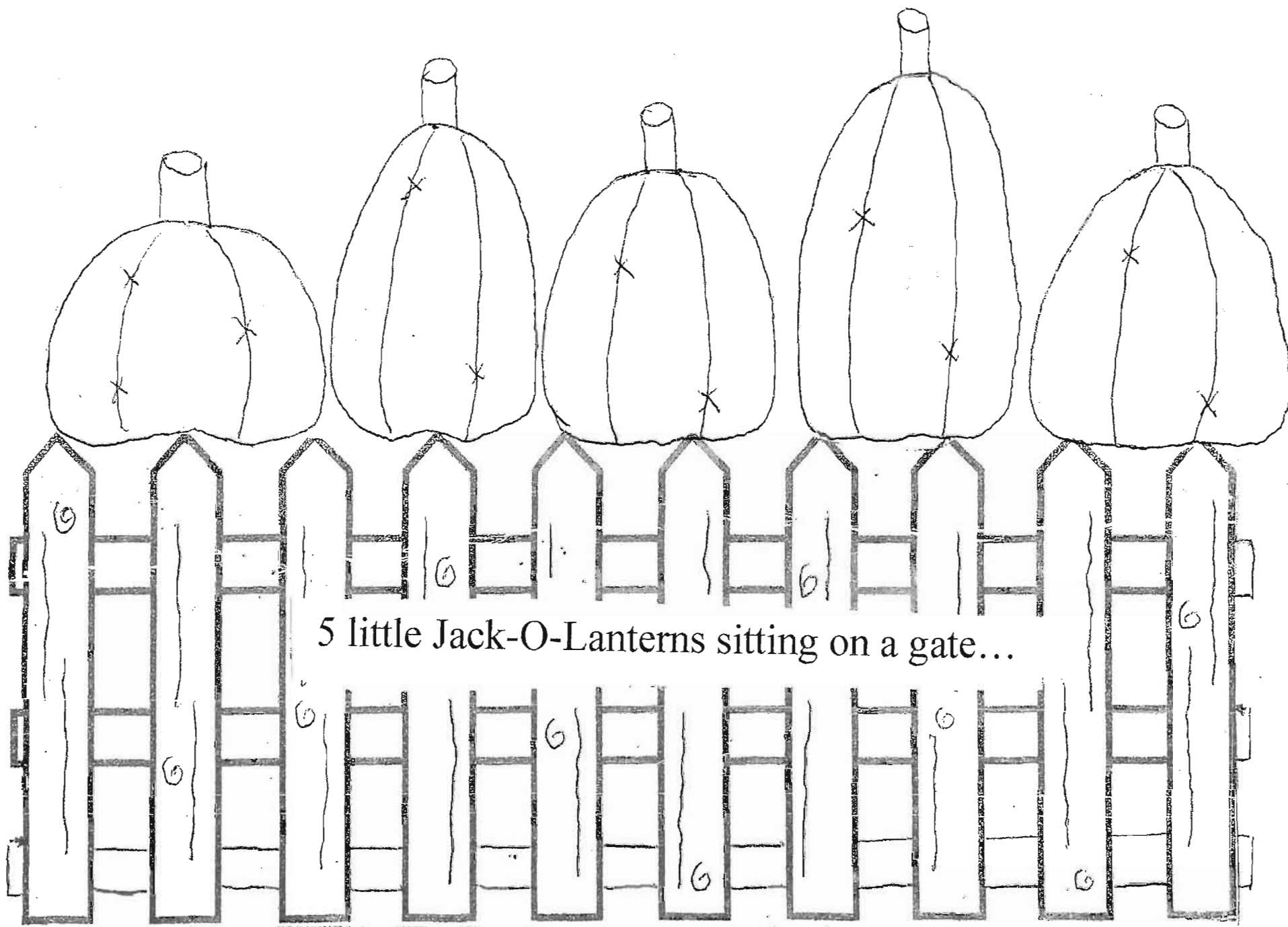
1. Run off masters
2. I cut the 1st through 4<sup>th</sup> pumpkin pages off so that only those pumpkins show so that when you staple the booklet, you can read the ordinal numbers in a row, it also makes the booklet look cuter.
3. Collate and staple the books.
4. Children write their name on the top.
5. Children trace their pumpkins orange, color the stems green, and draw a face on each of the pumpkins on the first page.
6. Children do that for each of the ordinal-speaking pumpkins on the consecutive pages.
7. Students cut out the pumpkins and glue them “rolling into the night” on the last page.
8. As a whole group, read the story aloud. I read the sentence and my students repeat it twice.
9. Encourage the children to re-read it and share the story with their families that evening.
10. Pair up students, pass out dice and have them play the matching games.
11. After the game, children take their papers to their back packs.

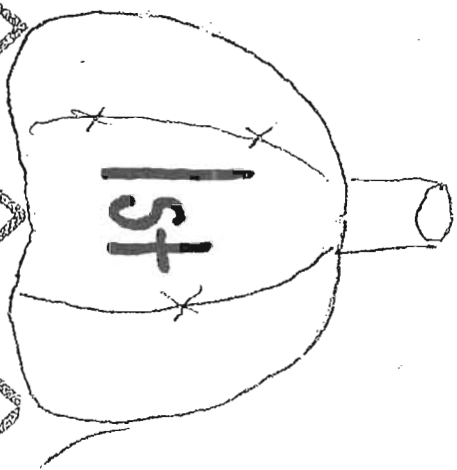
## **Pumpkins Rolling Into The Night Dice Game**

*To be played with the 5 Little Jack-O-Lanterns "Easy Reader" Booklet and other Table Top Activities*

### **Directions:**

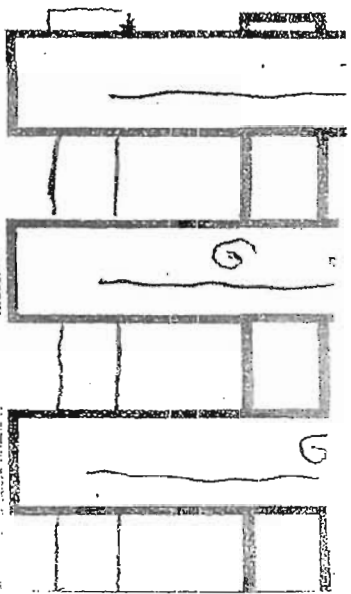
1. Children choose a partner.
2. Children roll the dice to see who goes first.
3. High number wins.
4. Children roll and color in that numbered pumpkin shape.
5. If they roll a 6 they lose their turn.
6. If they have already rolled that number they pass the dice to their partner.
7. The child who colors in all their pumpkin number-shapes first is the winner.
8. This game goes fast so I've included a fence master too.
9. When they are done with the first game, have them DRAW their own pumpkin, writing a 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, etc ordinal number in it. Same rules as the first.

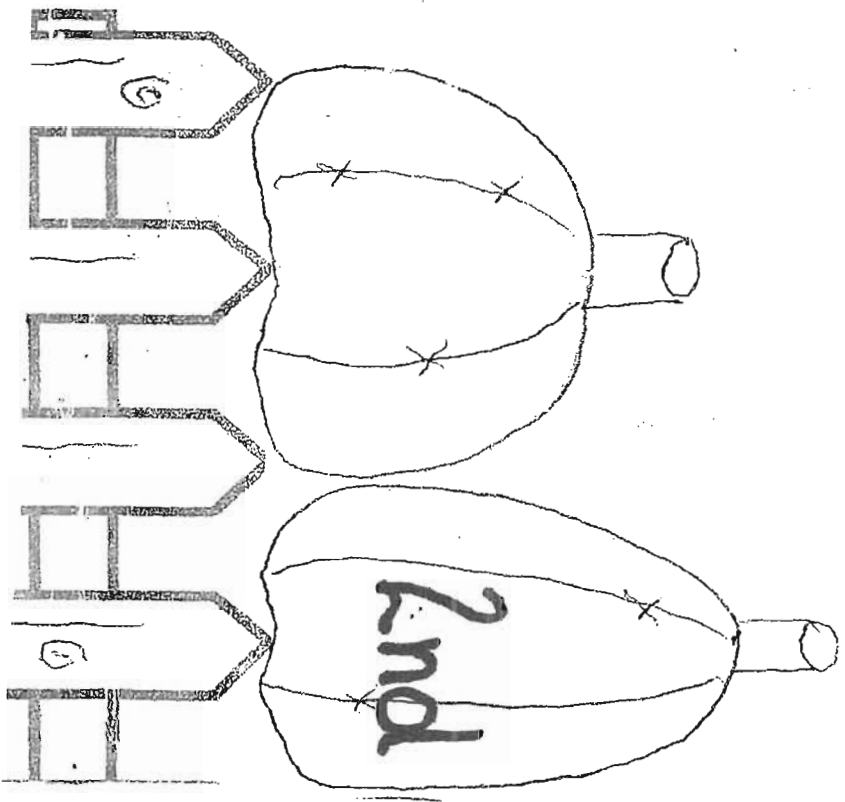




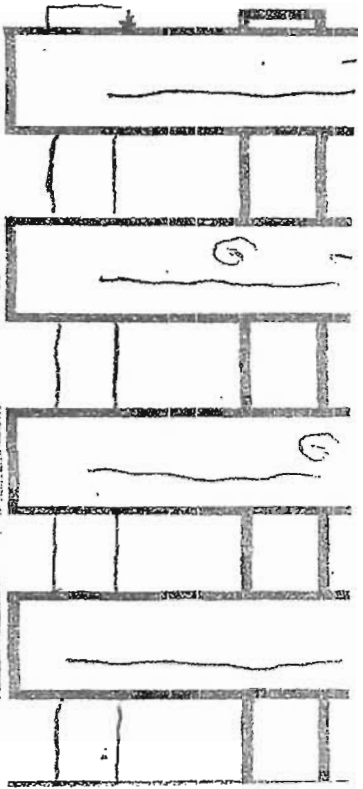
The 1<sup>st</sup> one said,

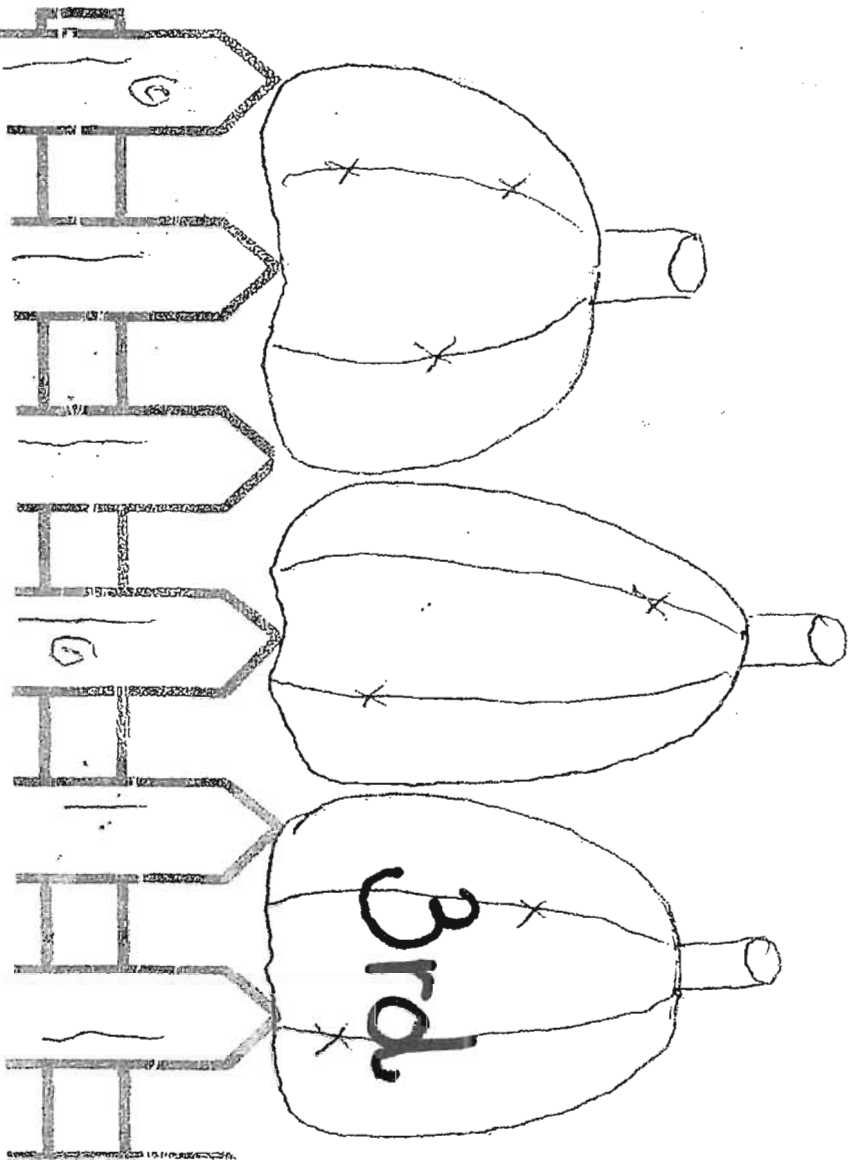

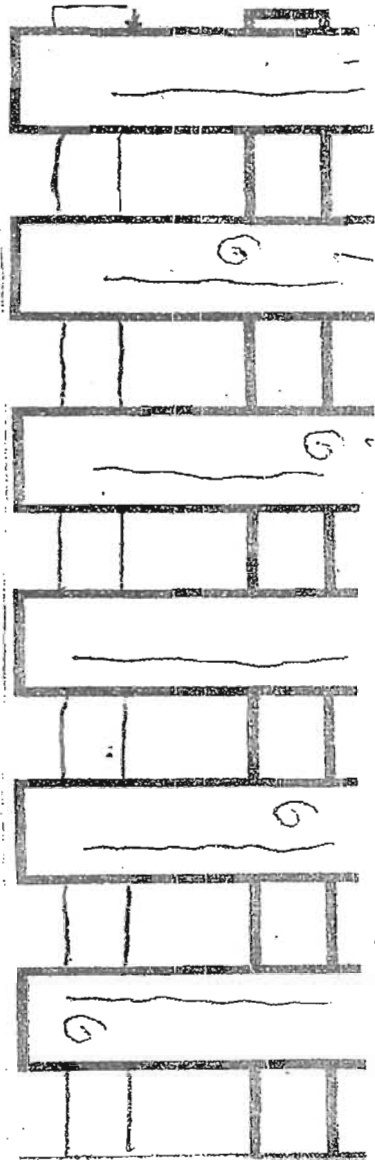


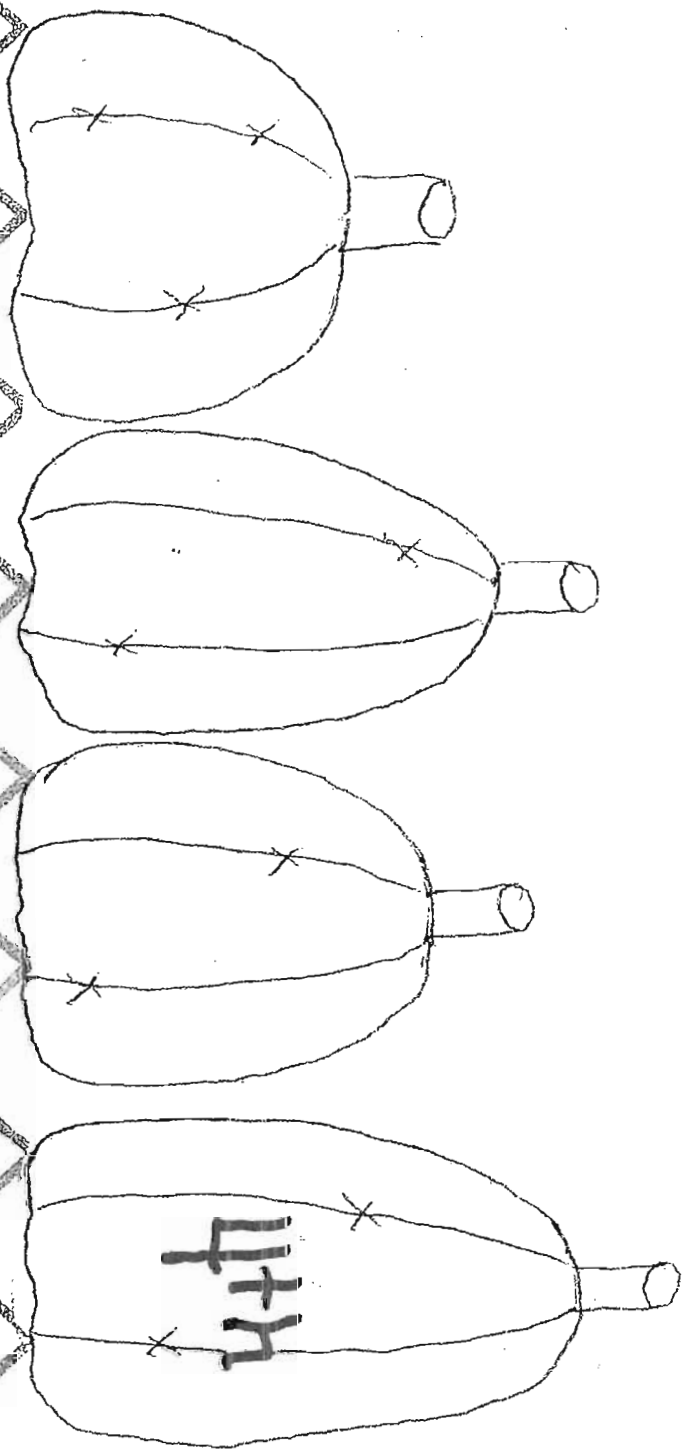
The 2<sup>nd</sup> one said, "I hear a noise!"



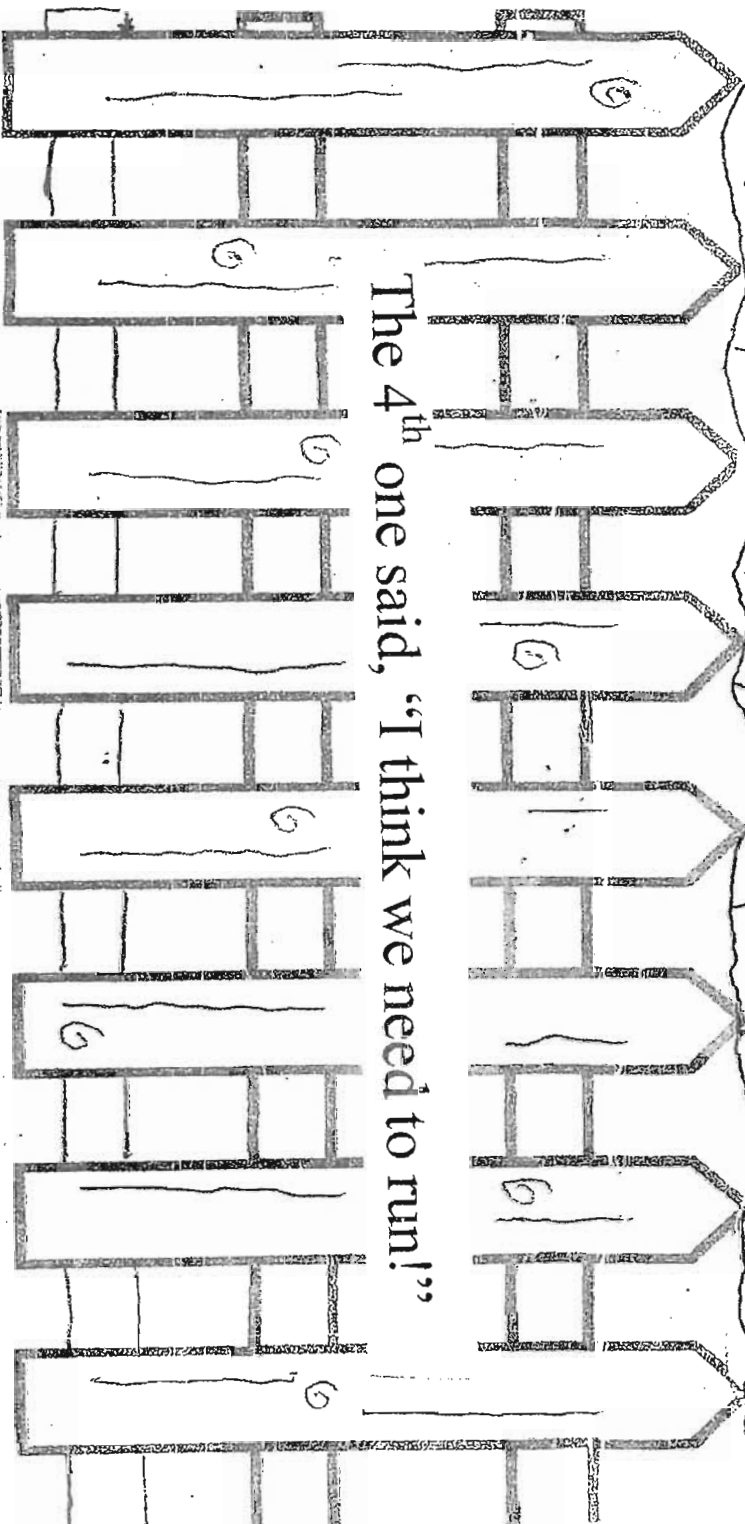


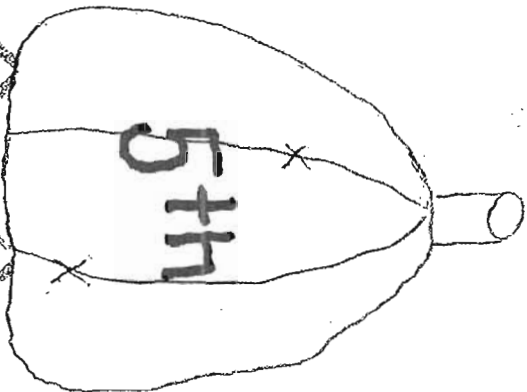
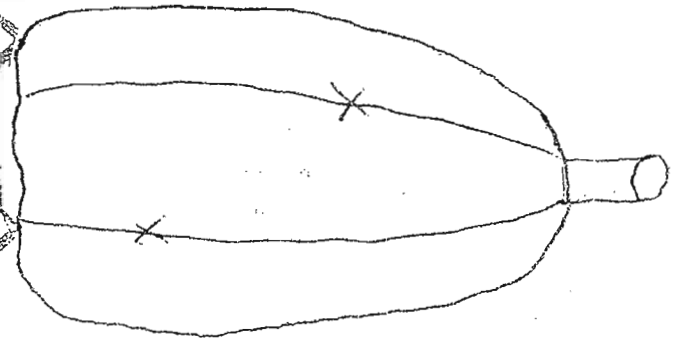
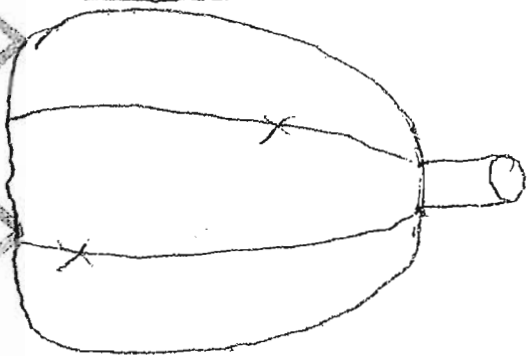
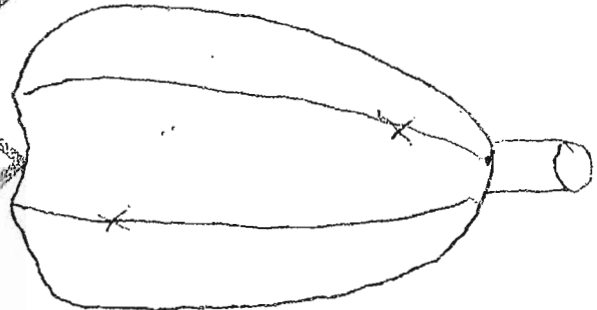
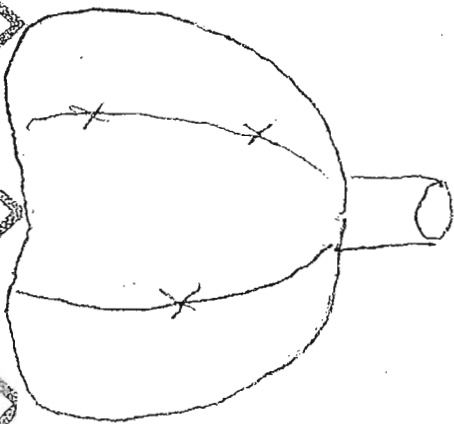
The 3<sup>rd</sup> one said, "It's just some boys!"



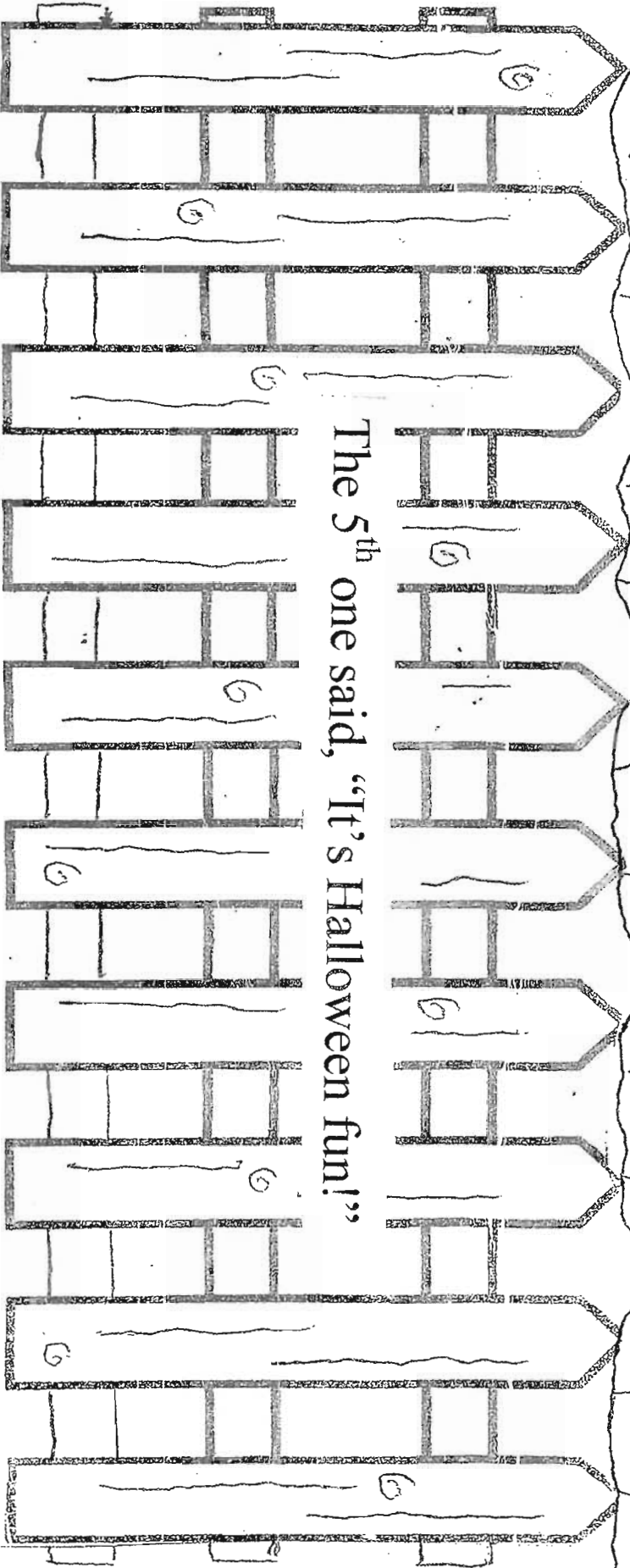


The 4<sup>th</sup> one said, "I think we need to run!"



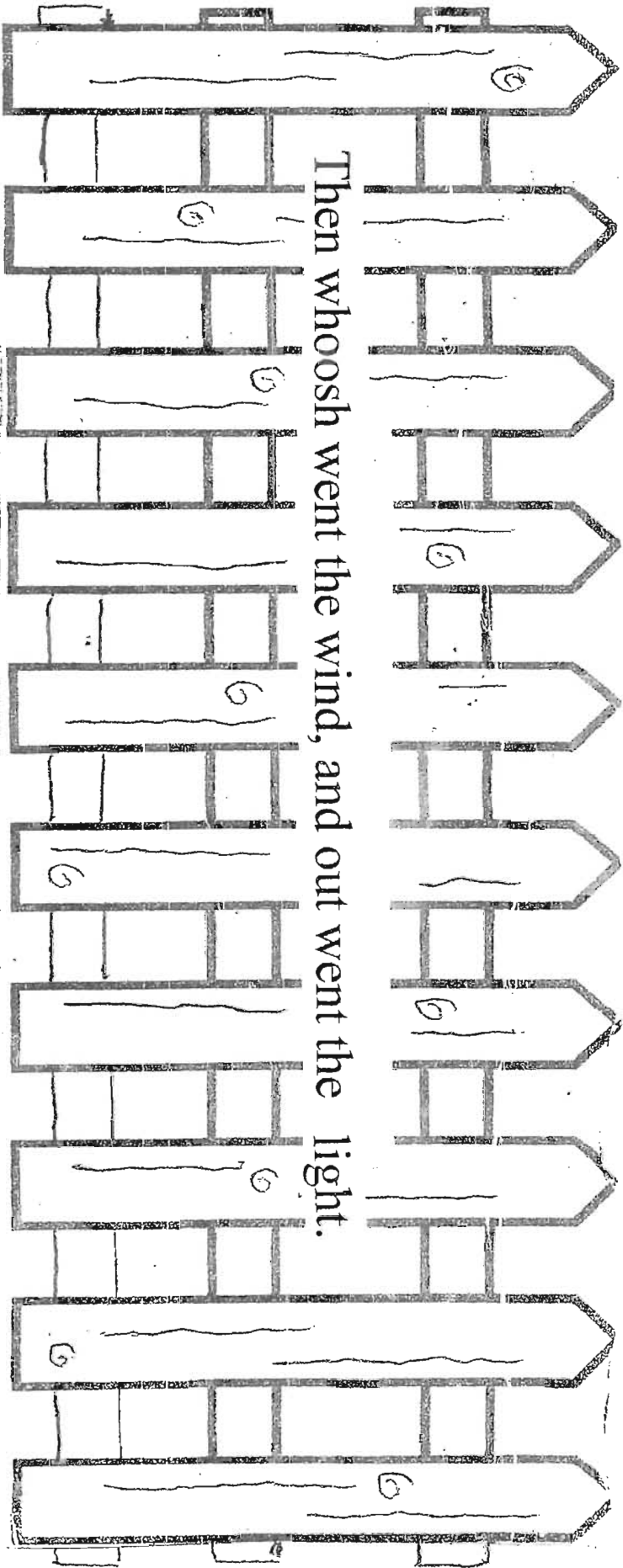


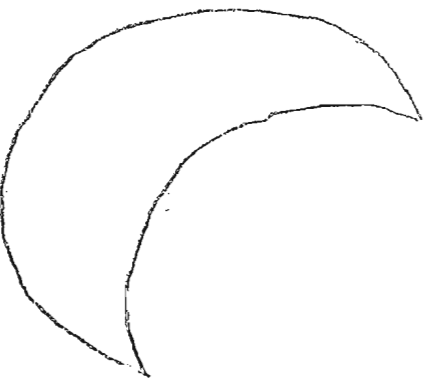
The 5<sup>th</sup> one said, "It's Halloween fun!"
