## **Bat Double Info-Strip Slider**

### **Materials:**

- White construction paper
- Scissors

### **Directions:**

#### **Prep:**

- Run off master.
- Pre-cut sliders
- Pre-cut slits in slider.

#### **The next day...**

1. Children CUT out their slider.
2. Students WRITE their name on the BACK of their slider.
3. Children insert slider from the back to the front. Teacher decides what slider students will be working on.
4. As a whole group, we use the manipulative to review the information on the slider.
5. I encourage the children to do it again for their parents and include a note about the slider in my newsletter.
6. I ask parents to ask their child to share their slider with them. It helps reinforce lessons, builds self-esteem, and shows their child that they care about what they are learning in school.
7. Since we have a slider for each theme, they make a nice collection.
8. After my students are done with their slider, they clean up their work station, leave their slider at the table and transition to a Tummy Tubby Time activity. When everyone is done, they get their slider and sit on our *Circle of Friends* carpet.
9. Depending on time, we insert 1 or 2 sliders and review the material as a whole group. I'll have them put the shortest slider in, take the other sliders back to their desk, and we'll review body parts (put your slider on your elbow, knee, wrist etc.), then we'll use it for spatial directions; (put your slider on, behind, above, beside you.) We'll finish up with the *Slider Pokey* and finally "Blast Off" counting from 10-0 and then go put our sliders in our backpacks. ☺



- Believe it not, micro-bats can eat up to 300 hundred bugs an hour! These bugs include mosquitoes, moths, locus, grasshoppers, etc. Such bugs can destroy crops and spread disease. American farmer's biggest pest is the Corn earworm moth. One bat can eat 20 female moths a night reducing the number of crop eating caterpillars.
- 
- There are many bats that live on the nectar from the flower of plants. There are some flowers that only bloom at night and the bat is the only animal that assists in the pollination of these plants. Cactus like the Agave are an example.
- 
- Bananas, avocados, dates, figs, peaches, mangoes, cloves, cashews, and agave are other trees that all benefit from bats as they pollinate or spread their seeds.
- 
- Bats will also eat bugs that destroy crops and plants.
- 
- Bats help scatter seeds. (They eat the ripe fruit and fly somewhere else, as the food passes through them, seeds are sown.)

- Echolocation is a method of sensory perception by which certain animals orient themselves to their surroundings, detect obstacles, communicate with others, and find food.

- 
- During echolocation a series of short, high-pitched sounds are emitted by an animal. These sounds travel out away from the animal and then bounce off objects and surfaces in the animal's path creating an echo. The echo returns to the animal, giving it a sense about what is in its path. A bat can determine an object's size, shape, direction, distance, and motion. This echolocation system is so accurate that bats can detect insects the size of gnats and objects as fine as a human hair.
- Scientists would like to know more about how bats use echolocation so they can help blind people detect objects with sound.

- Bats send out sound waves using their mouth or nose. When the sound hits an object an echo comes back. The bat can identify an object by the sound of the echo. They can even tell the size, shape and texture of a tiny insect from its echo . Most bats use echolocation to navigate in the dark and find food.

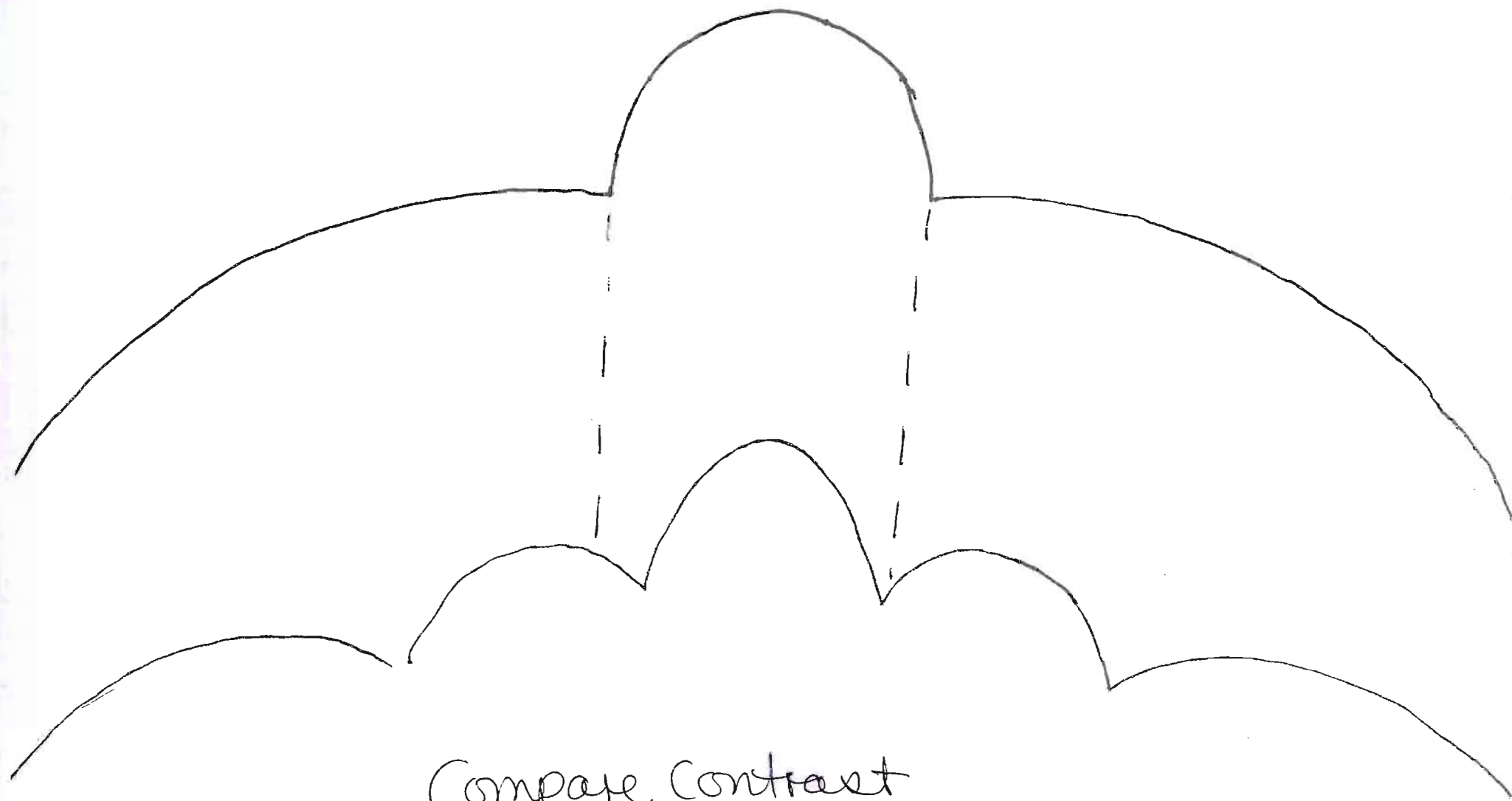
### **Materials:**

- Construction paper
- Scissors
- Ink pens
- Hole punch
- Yarn

### **Directions:**

- Discuss the above topic.
- Have children discuss several things they are batty over, and several things that drive them batty.
- Run off the bat master on a variety of colored construction paper.
- Students cut out their bats.
- Students write 5 things that they are batty over: (Nuts for, can’t get enough of, passionate about) on the back of the bat and...
- 5 things/people that drive them batty.(Make them crazy, upset them etc.)
- Students write their name on the head portion on one side and draw eyes on the other side.
- Fold on the dashed lines so the bats can flap their wings and fly.
- You can punch a hole in the middle-top of the bat head, tie with a loop of yarn and hang from the ceiling or send the bat-tastic writing home.

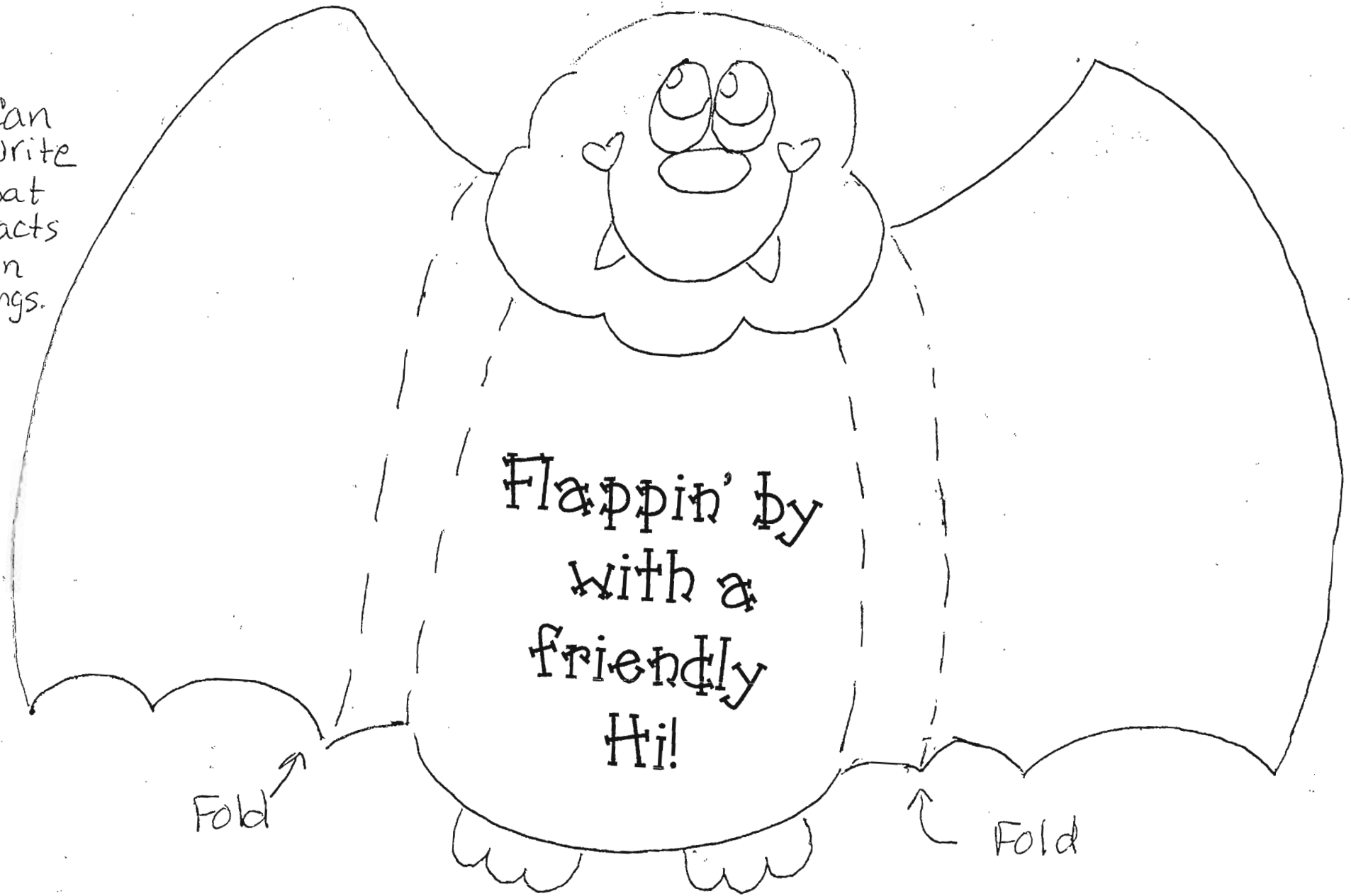

## **Glitter Bat**

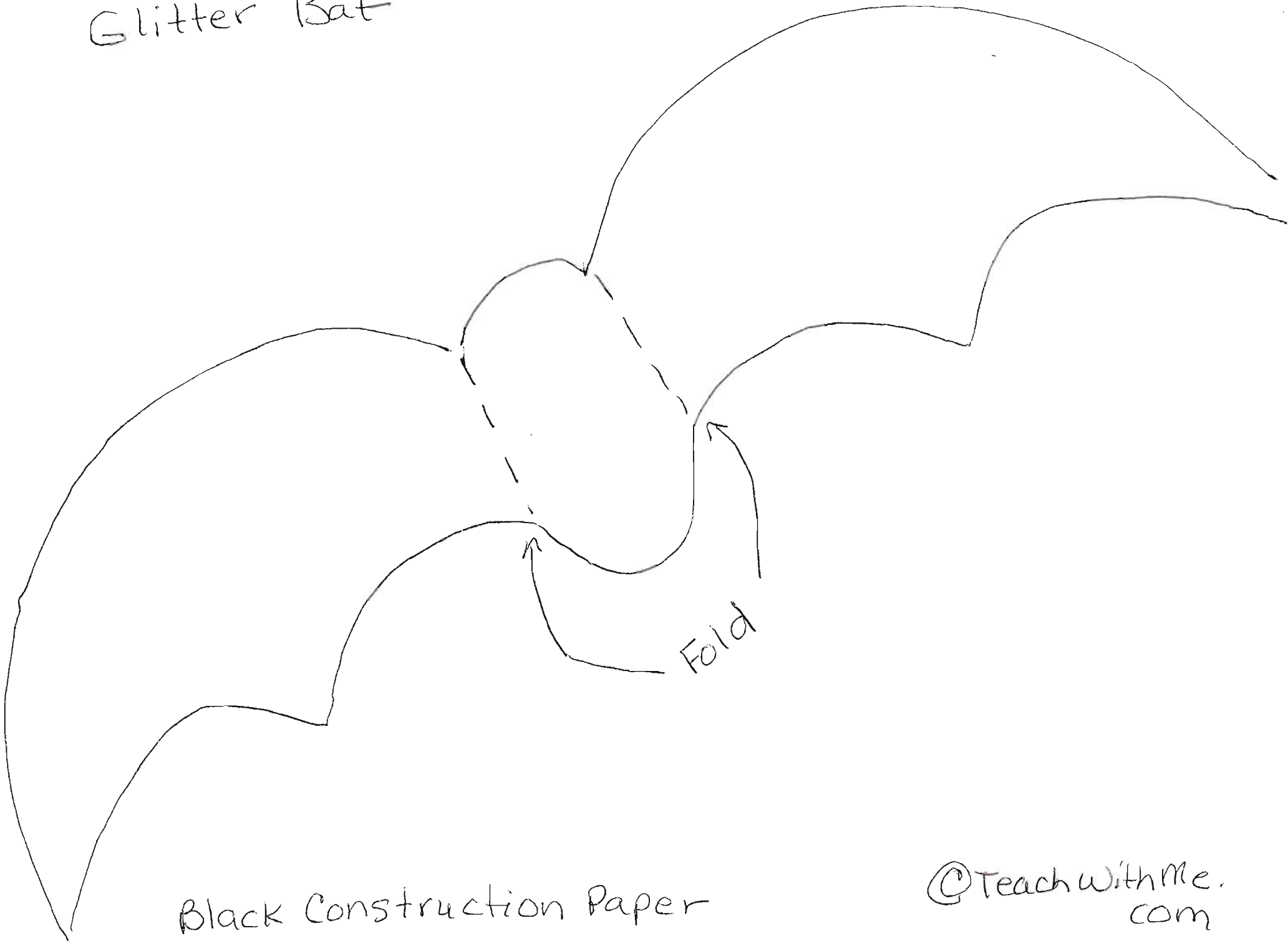
### **Materials:**

- Black construction paper
- Fish line
- Hole punch
- Elmer's glue
- Light blue, royal blue, silver, & purple glitter
- White crayons

### **Directions:**

1. I set this up as a center on a table.
2. I have scrap paper for them to lay their bat down on, and a paper plate to shake the excess glitter off into, so that I can pour it back into the bottle.
3. They can carry their bat on the sheet of scratch paper to the drying area.
4. Students CUT out their bat
5. Children WRITE their name on the back with a white crayon.
6. Students FOLD their wings on the dashed lines.
7. I call children who are done to the table and work with them one-on-one
8. Make sure they have their name on their bat.
9. Children choose a glitter color.
10. Children drizzle glue on the wings.
11. Students sprinkle glitter on top of the glue.
12. Shake off excess into the paper plate.
13. Pour the excess back into the shaker jar.
14. Set bat aside to dry.
15. Punch a hole in the top middle of the head.
16. Tie with a loop of fish line.
17. Re-bend the wings so that they flap.
18. Suspend from the ceiling. Because you can't see the fish line, they look they are floating and flying on their own!

### **Directions:**

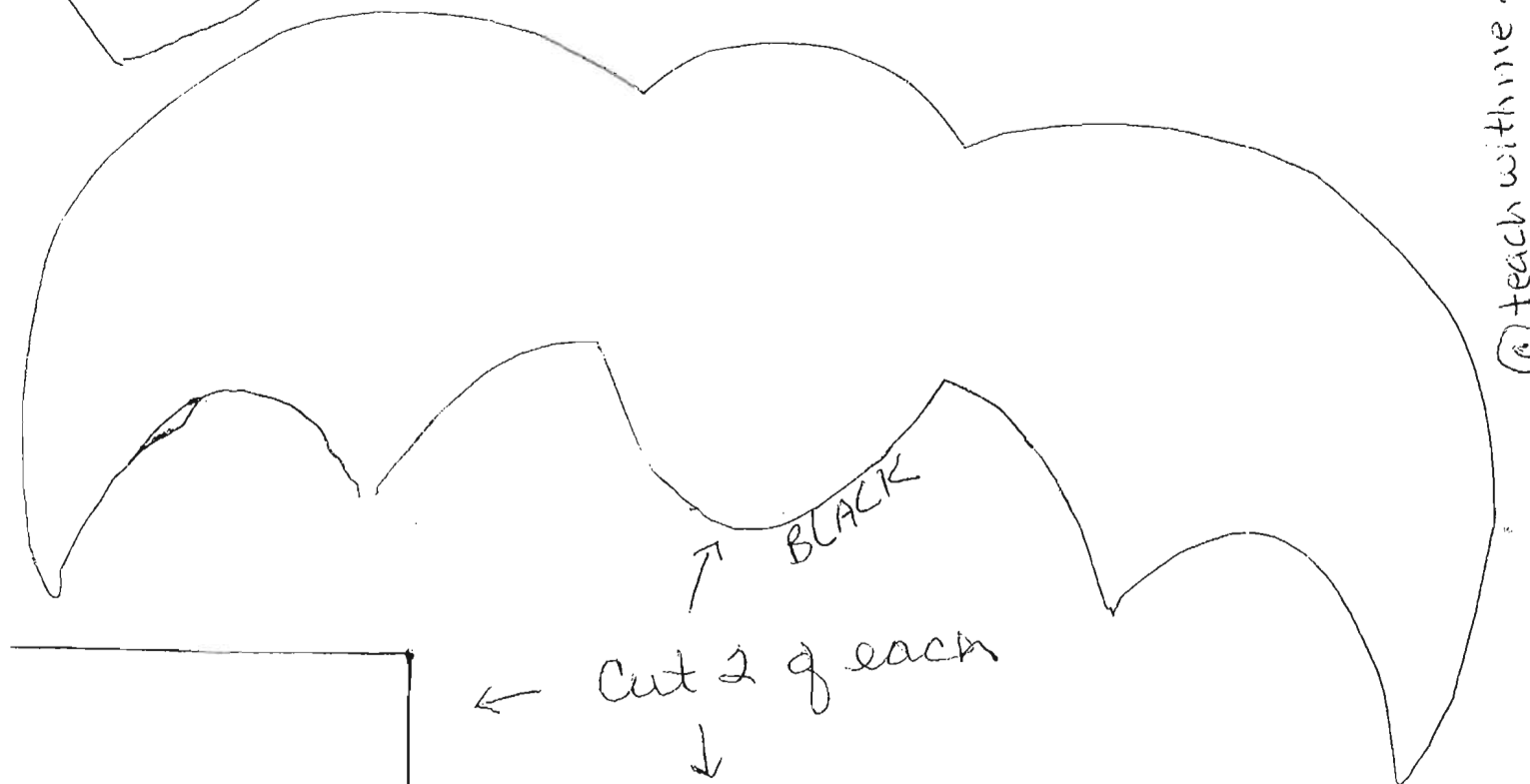
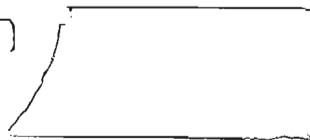
1. Tie a loop in a 24 inch piece of yarn. Add a yarn bow for extra pizzazz.
2. Trace and cut out 2 bats.
3. Add details with a white or silver crayon.
4. Type up, cut and glue on the "I'm batty over you."caption to 1 side of the bat.
5. Place the bat face down, rub glue over it, place the yarn down the middle, press the other bat on top.
6. Type up, cut and glue "Have a spook-tacular Halloween" caption to a purple rectangle.
7. Place it face down, rub the glue over it, place the yarn down the middle, press the other rectangle on top.
8. Cut out a pink heart, glue it to the purple rectangle.
9. Poke a hole in the middle of a Kleenex. Pull the piece of yarn through.
10. Ball up another piece of Kleenex and tie a bow around the "neck" making a ghost "head". A coffee filter also works instead of Kleenex.
11. Using a black marker, make 2 eyes.
12. Trace and cut out the pumpkins, add details with crayons.
13. Cut and glue the "Love from your little 'punkin'" caption to one of the pumpkins.
14. Place it face down, rub the glue over it, place the yarn down the middle, press the other pumpkin on top.
15. Child signs their name on the other side, and glues their school photo under their signature.



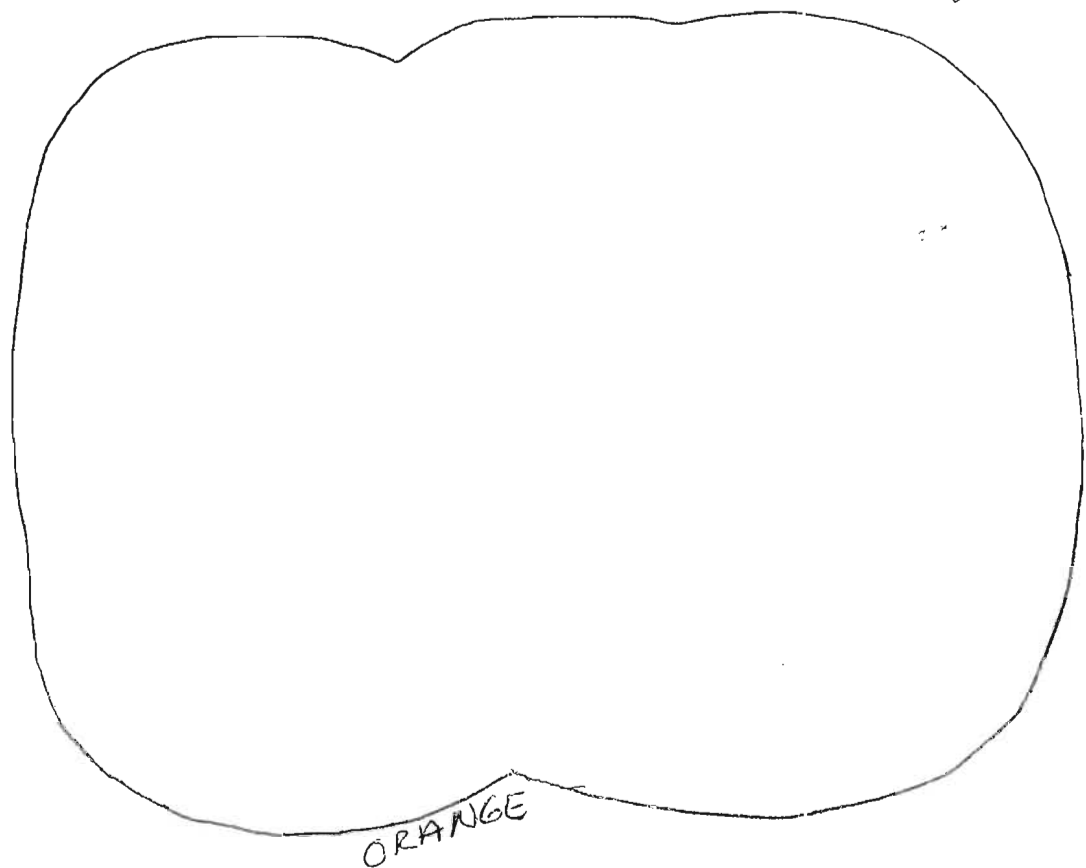

## **I'm Just Batty Over Counting Booklet**

### **Materials:**

- Black construction paper
- Scissors
- Stapler
- Masters
- White crayon
- *Optional:* Wiggle eyes & Glue dots

### **Directions:**

1. Run Off Masters
2. Children cut out their bat.
3. Children write their name on the back.
4. This is a lot of cutting for my little ones. As one of my students complained: *"Mrs. Henderson my hand ran out of gas!"*
5. So I only have them cut out the first 5 bat bodies; I have a room-mommy cut out the 2<sup>nd</sup> set.
6. Children sequence the numbers. This gives me a chance to whole-group assess.
7. I have the front black body oval pre-cut. We review this shape through out the day.
8. Staple the booklet, and then staple it again to the whole bat.
9. Assist the child in gluing on wiggle eyes.
10. I have them add details with a white crayon.
11. When everyone is finished, we clean up and gather on our Circle of friends carpet to read the booklet.
12. We flip through the numbers counting them in English and Spanish.
13. I play a few games of "Speed" with them. It's a game I made up, where I call out a number and they quickly flip through their booklet to find that number. The first one to hold it up is the winner. It's a great way to whole-group assess and gets them ready for future Timed Tests and Mad-Minute Math.
14. We finish by counting backwards "Blasting Off" to our lockers to put our booklets in our backpacks.
