



# Sam's Senses

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
## Materials:

- orange, yellow and white construction paper
- paper cutter
- crayons
- glue sticks
- scissors
- hole punch and yarn if you're going to hang from the ceiling.

## Directions:

1. Run off Sam on orange construction paper.
2. Students add some color with crayons and then cut Sam out.
3. Run off the 5 senses words and give each student a strip to cut and glue to Sam, so that his senses are labeled.
4. Cut strips of yellow construction paper (1x12).
5. Students accordion fold and use 2 strips to make Sam's arms.
6. Children trace their hands (with their fingers spread) on white construction paper.
7. They cut and glue them to the ends of the accordion arms of Sam.
8. When everyone is done, review the 5 senses on Sam as well as on students.
9. These look sweet hung back-to-back from the ceiling, or as a border across the top of a hallway wall.

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
