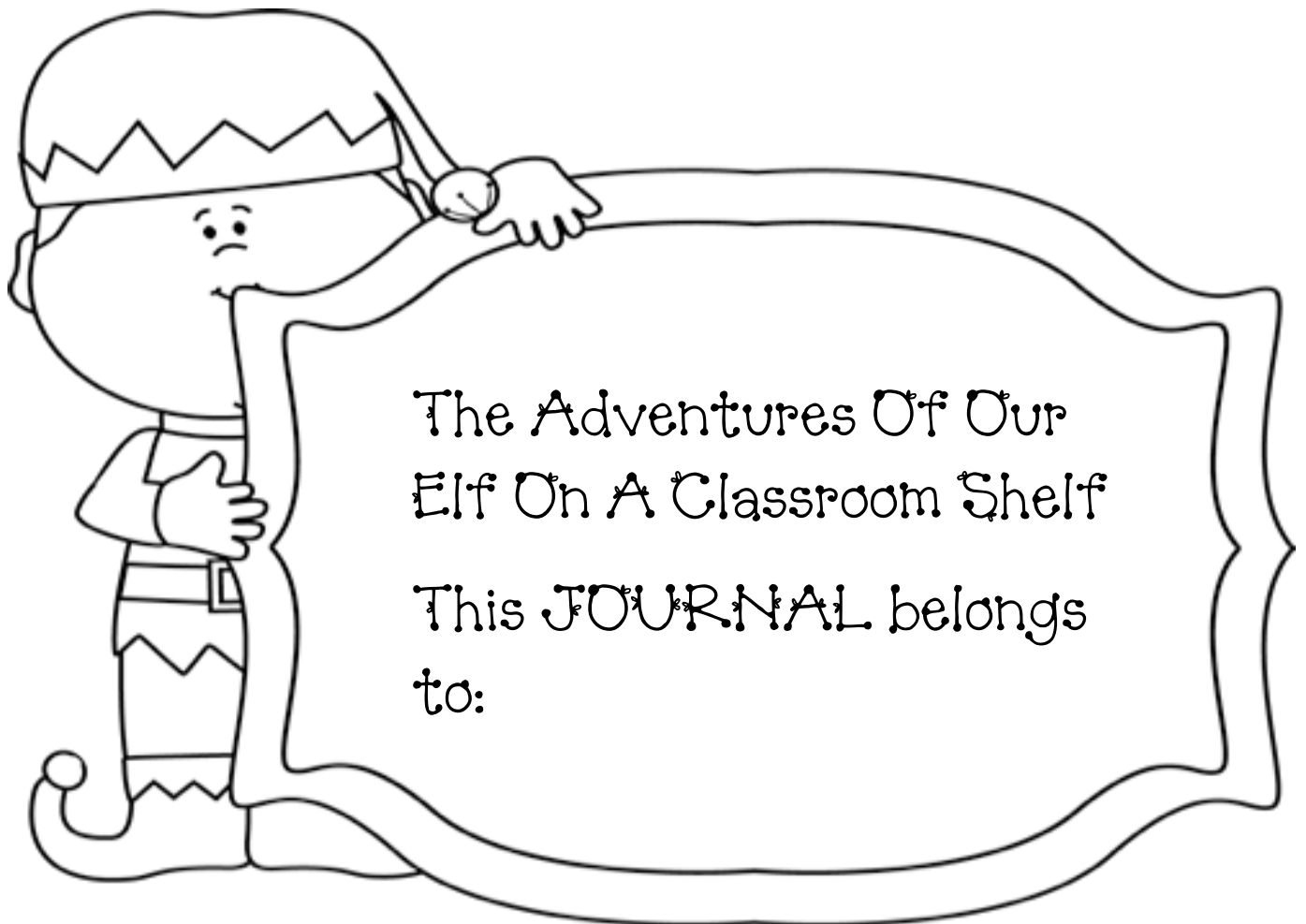
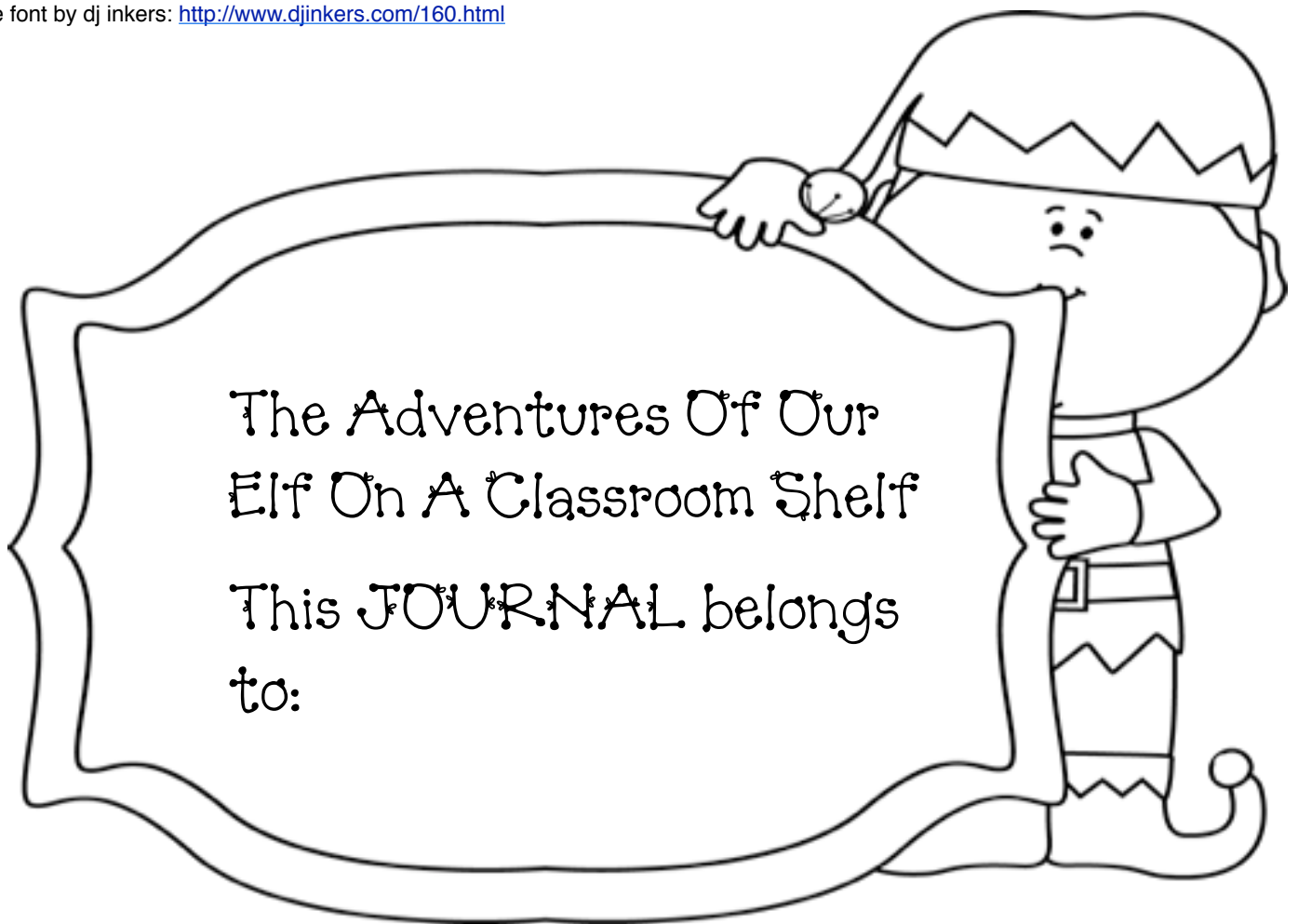


What did the elf do today?

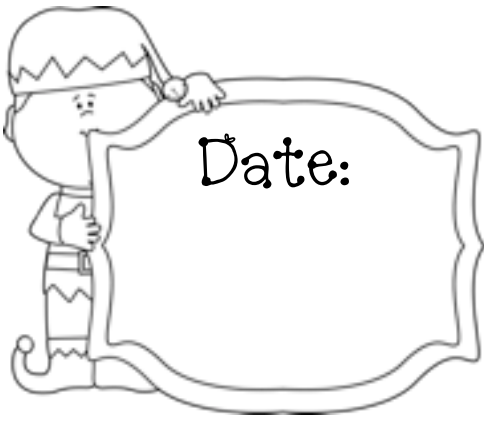


Run off and have students glue to the front of their journal. They get to color in a star each time they do a good job writing in their journals or whatever else you deem appropriate.
