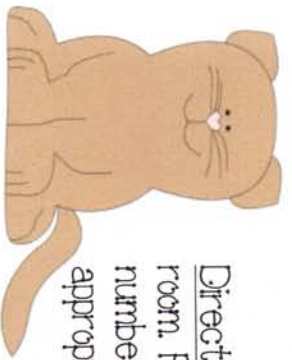


This activity helps with **Common Core State Standard: RF.1.1**
Students will enjoy capturing cat cards as they hunt for the 12 kitty sentence cards that are missing a capital letter and end punctuation.

- Laminate your cards.
- Decide which 10 you want to use for the kittens have escaped hunt and number them with a dry erase marker.
- If you use a permanent marker, a *Mr. Clean Eraser* will wipe off the numbers.
- Put a magnet on the back, so students can put the cards up on your white board, or use a pocket chart for them to tuck them in.
- Sprinkle the cards around the room.
- Students find them and put them on the white board or in your pocket chart in 1-10 order, so that they can rewrite the sentences on their recording sheet, putting in a beginning capital letter, and the appropriate punctuation.
- Before students take their seats and work on their own papers, read the cards as a whole group, adding inflection so that students can determine where an exclamation mark goes.
- When everyone is done, have students gather in front of the board and have them take turns filling in the correct answers with a red dry erase marker.
- A nice "get the wiggles out" activity to do afterwards, is to do the Pig Pokey and have students shake themselves about.
- Later, you can use different sentences and use the recording sheets as an assessment.
- This packet also includes a certificate of praise.
