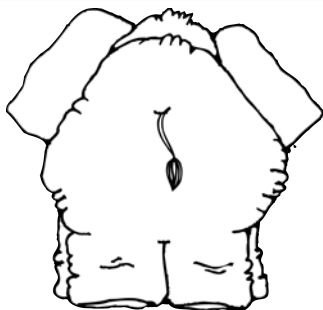
Save paper! Print, laminate & trim. Using a dry erase marker, children practice writing their name daily, working on appropriate size of their letters.











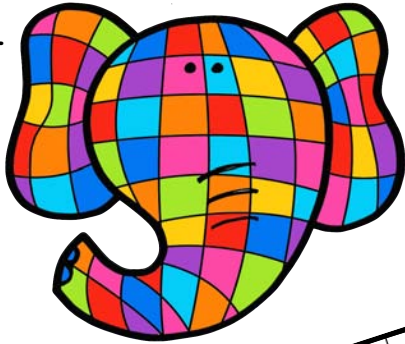

- Run off the elephant pattern on card stock or white construction paper.
- Children color and trim.
- Run off the pennant pattern on a variety of colors of construction paper.
- Children choose one, write their name on it and trim, folding over the end gluing the pipe cleaner in place.
- These make an adorable bulletin board.
- Use the poster as the center of your display.
- The flag can also be bent up to make a free-standing, place marker for children to refer to.





Set this up as a center for children to transition to after they have completed their morning work or table top. This is a great incentive to keep them focussed.

Run off several copies of the pattern. Children place their coffee filter over the paper and trace the lines with a black ink pen.

Give the children a sheet of scratch paper to place their filter on, but if you don't want to mess with that, they can paint right on the table top.

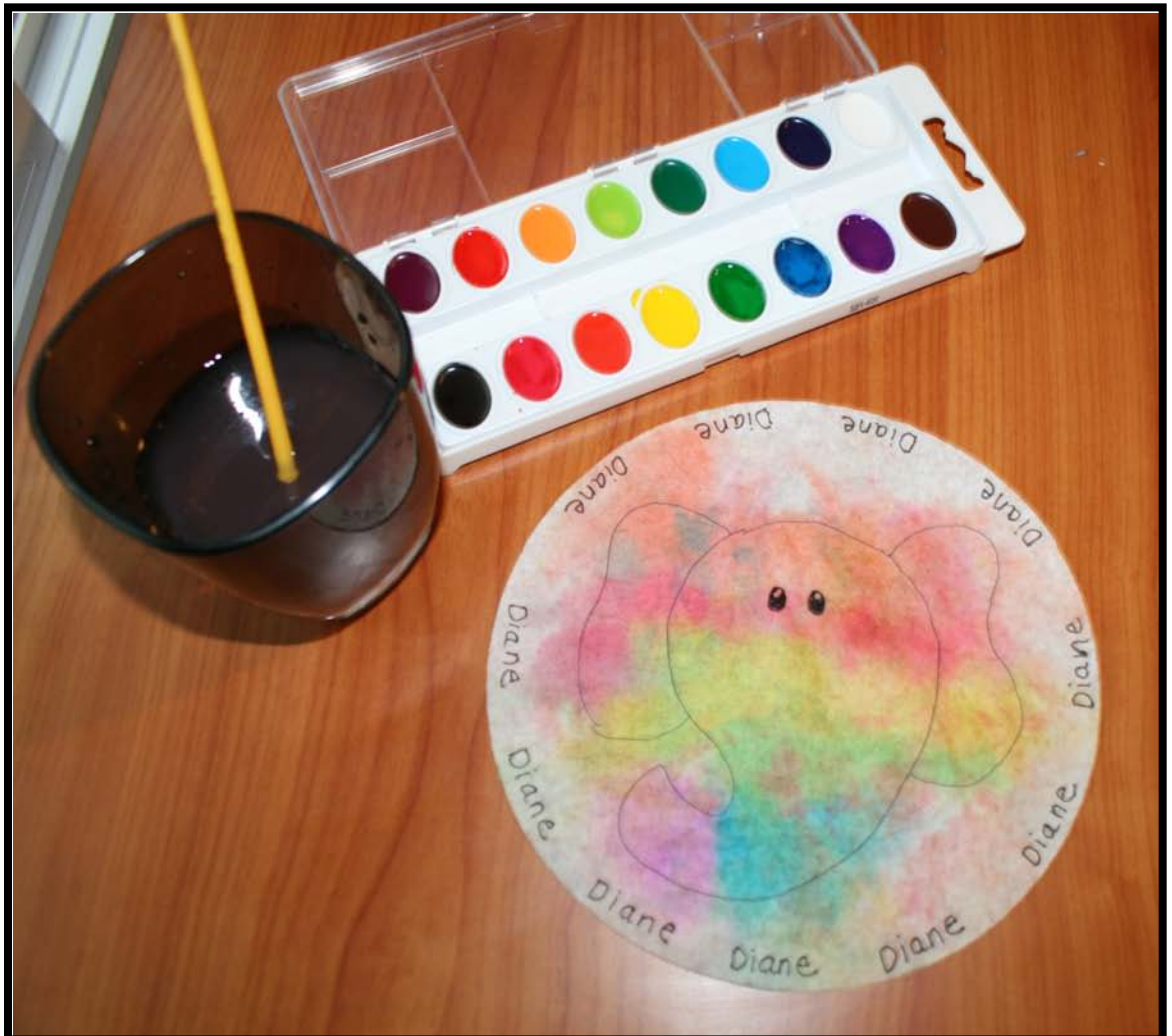
The watercolors will "bleed" through onto the table, but easily come off with a sponge or damp paper towel.

Remind them to use plenty of water so that colors will "blend".

They need to go over each "stripe" several times with that color, so that enough paint "sticks" to the filter so their elephant is vibrant and not too faint or "washed out" when it dries.

Because the filter is spritzed with water, "peeling" it up off the table can be a bit tricky, so I do this for my students so they don't tear their creation.

There's a ledge under our sunny window, we use as a drying center, but you could place some waxed paper down somewhere out of the way and use that as well.





Throughout the year I have my students write with all kinds of things.

Giving children a variety of writing tools, simply keeps things interesting and fun, so they'll want to continue to practice writing their names.

Here's another option for the coffee filter watercolor craftivity.

Instead of keeping the filter as a circle, have children cut out their elephant.

Make sure the filters are really dry.

Students glue their elephant to the bottom of a "blackboard" then write their name in chalk at the top.

To make things more colorful, have them use a different color for each letter, 'til they run out of colors, then repeat that color pattern if they have a long name.

I used sidewalk chalk, but you could also give them the option of colored chalk in a box which is not as fat.

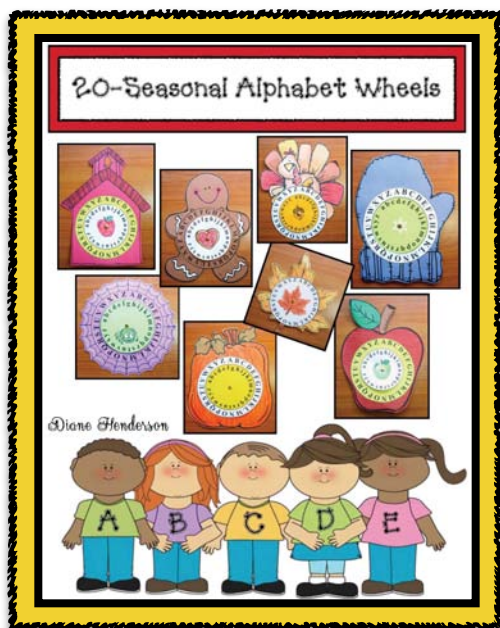
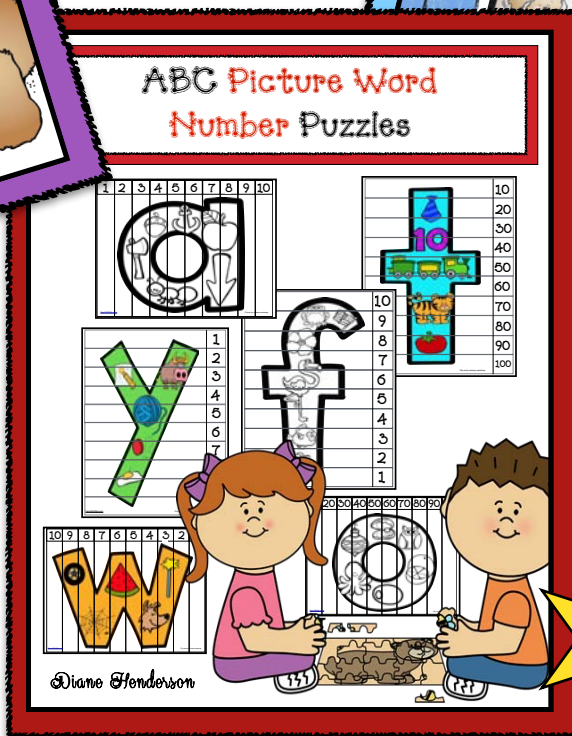
Afterwards, we go outside and practice writing our names, letters, shapes & numbers with the sidewalk chalk. They really enjoy this activity.

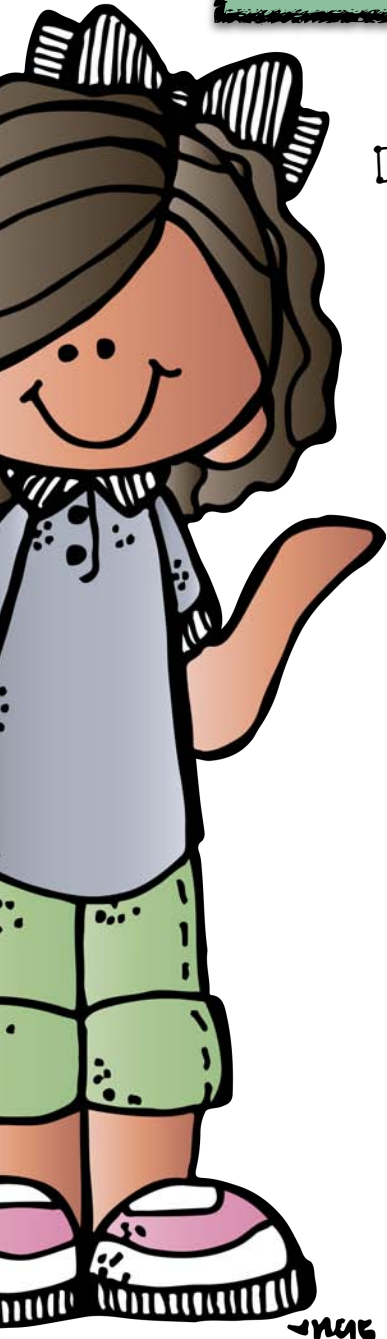
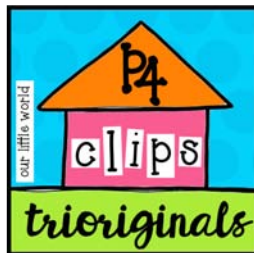
