They are always exhausted from their midnight escapades and are happy to hang around and do nothing but stare, as they rest in the warm sun.





Scarecrows like being lazy.

This scarecrow is stuffed with money ...




There are **42 writing prompts** for students to pick from. Toss them in a basket & allow students to pick 3. They choose their favorite, then toss the other two back.




Tip:

Stack all 7 pages together; add a few staples to hold them in place then snip all 42 at once.

I spent quite a bit of time thinking up highly motivational prompts that I think your students will get excited about.



Students add a bit of color to the autumn patches then glue this prompt to their completed scarecrow.




Shading, wiggle eyes, and a sunflower add some 3D pop.



Students can glue their writing prompt horizontally or vertically.

I've included 3 completed prompts, so that you can quickly & easily make an example to share.

Besides the **5 different writing prompt** papers, I've also included **3 hat patterns** to choose from.

Students can **draw** their own face, use the face that's **provided**, or **cut & glue** facial features from the various pattern pieces.

At night, the scarecrows come to life! They help each other get down off their posts then tromp through the cornfields to Old MacDonald's farm, for a secret barn dance.


They have a great time swinging, swaying, singing and stomping about. Some even lose a bit of their stuffing!



There are 5 writing prompt worksheets with borders for students to choose from.
