





My "two lips"

- Run off tulips on a variety of colored construction paper.
- Students cut out their 2 tulips.
- Children cut the dashed-lined tulip in half.
- Lay the whole tulip on top of the stem, (A strip of 1x12 inch green paper) lay the 2 halves on top of the whole tulip, so that they overlap enough, so that you can poke a hole in the bottom and attach everything with a brass brad.
- The top tulip petals open to reveal a spring or Mother's Day message from the child.
- They can compose this themselves, or glue my saying inside.
- Include a school picture to make it even more of a keepsake.
- Trace their hand on a folded sheet of green construction paper.
- Cut once to make 2 handprints. These become the leaves of the tulip. Attach with a glue stick.
