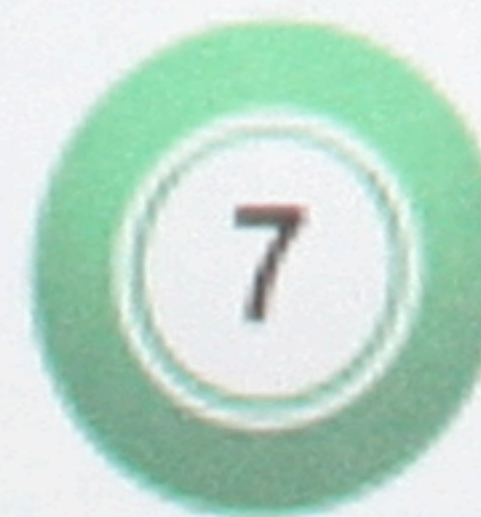
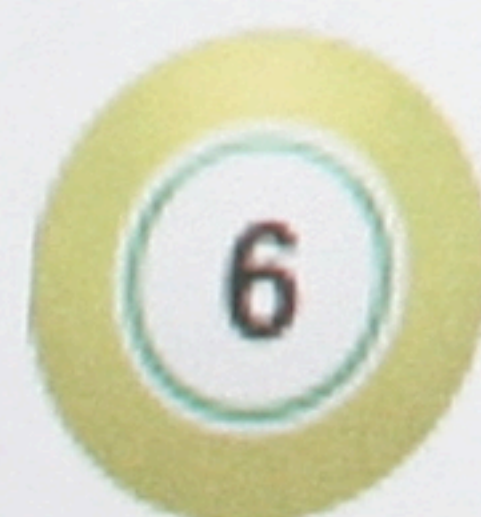

Pool Ball Counting Cards

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Here are some things you can do with the cards:

- Print off the set of teacher cards, laminate and cut out.
- Hang on the wall and use as a number line.
- Make an extra set; punch a hole at the top and insert a split ring.
- Use them as flashcards during a whole group setting.
- Run off the student cards.
- Children cut out and sequence.
- They too can make a split-ring booklet.
- Hole punch the top and have them bend a paperclip into a circle.
- Insert cards and put a piece of tape around the two ends of the circle-clip.
- Before they ring bind their cards, have them choose a partner.
- Students mix up their cards and then play ***“Speed”*** against each other to see who can sequence them from 1-10 or from 10-0 the quickest.
- Make extra sets and laminate.
- Cut out to make Memory Match games. (Print one on a light colored copy paper so that it is easier for students to make matches.)
- Make a set and hot glue them to 10 large Popsicle sticks.
- Use them as manipulatives during story time when you read books involving counting and numbers. Pass them out to students and have them hold up the “number puppet” when their number is being read.
- Pass them out and give students 1 minute to sequence themselves. Continue playing ‘til everyone has had a turn.
- Put them in a bag along with the blast off balls.
- Students sit in a circle and pull out a ball, show and say the number.
- If they grab a blast off ball, students hunch down, count backwards from 10-0 and then jump up yelling, ***“Blast off!”***
- Play ***“I Have; Who Has?”*** with the cards. Teacher has the #1 ball and says: ***“I have one, who has 2?”*** The #2 student then continues.
- Sprinkle 2 or 3 sets (depending on how many students you have in the class) around the room.
- Students pick up the balls and then sequence themselves.
