


Easy Candy Corn Fractions


Print, trim and trace onto an old file folder, then cut out. Use this template to trace once on yellow construction paper and cut out 3-6 medium circles at a time. Do the same with the small circle only use white paper. Students glue the yellow circle to the middle of the large orange circle and the small white circle to the middle of the medium yellow circle. Run off the fraction pattern. Students trim that circle and lay it on top of their 3-color circle then cut on the lines to make their 8 individual pieces of candy corn. Students can write numbers, letters, CVC words on their pieces or whatever else you want them to work on.


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



If you want to do this activity with PK kids, the most difficult thing for them will be to glue the yellow circle to the MIDDLE of this orange one and get it centered. To help them I designed this template that you can run off on orange paper. They then glue their yellow circle in the middle.














You can simply do the candy corn craft and leave it at that, but if you're also studying fractions use these pocket cards for a fun review.
