## Month Cards

### What else can you do with the month cards?

- Print and laminate and put on a split ring and use as flashcards for your students.
- Print and laminate and sprinkle them on the floor. Have students collect the cards before the timer rings.
- Run off sets on two different colors of paper so that you can make Memory Match games. This will make the game easier to play and expedite time.
- Put a set in a bag, basket or box and have students pull out a card and read it.. If they can't, they are out of the game.
- Run off copies of the cards. Students trace the words, cut out the cards, and add a cover to make Itty Bitty booklets so they can share them with their families and reinforce lessons learned at school.
- Collating their books is a great way to sequence the months in order.
- To reinforce another skill, before students collate their booklets, have them alphabetize the months.
- Play ***"I Have, Who Has?"***
- So that everyone can play you can make a double set where students say: ***"I have one of the January cards, who has the other?"***
- Play continues 'til all of the cards are gone.
- You could also simply allow 12 students to play . "***"I have January who has the next month, February?"*** " This way they'll learn the order of the months. Repeat the game 'til everyone has had a turn to hold a month card.

- Play continues 'til all of the cards are gone.
- Have students choose a partner and play "Speed" against them.
- Students mix up their cards. Together they say, "Ready-Set-Go!"
- Students put their cards in monthly order starting with January. The 1<sup>st</sup> one to do so is the winner.
- You could also have them do it in alphabetical order.
- Display the cards on the wall in a jumbled mess. Each day take a "mystery" month away. Choose a different child each day to guess which month is missing.
- Use them as flashcards.
- Use them on your calendar bulletin board.
- Cut them up and use them as puzzles.
- Use them as pocket cards.
